Neighbourhood Action Group (NAG) Meetings

As a Safer Neighbourhood Coordinator, part of my role is to chair and minute Neighbourhood Action Group (NAG) meetings in areas that exhibit the most Threat, Harm and Risk. These are held in:

- Sharrow, Abbeydale & Nether Edge
- Lowedges, Batemoor & Jordanthorpe
 - Gleadless Valley

The meeting is split into 2 parts; Part A and Part B.

Part A: Here we discuss localised crime and vulnerability issues. Partners such as Councillors, TARA representatives and community-based groups can attend.

Part B: Here we discuss nominals of concern that are involved in criminal behaviour, anti-social behaviour and organised crime. Only partners who are signed up the correct Data Sharing Agreements can attend part B.

This area is a key focus for the Neighbourhood Policing Team due some of the issues in the area in terms of crime, vulnerability, threat, harm & risk. The work being done in this area by SYP and the SNC includes:

- Disrupting organised crime/criminals
- Working with housing to support vulnerable tenants
- NAG meetings every 4 weeks to discuss key individuals of concern
- Having regular discussions with housing and other partners around specific addresses and nominals known to SYP and housing
- Working with key partners around the Dark Nights period to eliminate issues that have occurred in this area in the past
- Work in partnership with SYP's Fortify team who do specific targeted work around Organised Crime and County Lines.

- Working with housing to support vulnerable tenants
- NAG meetings every 8 weeks to discuss key individuals

- Creating a Problem Orientated Policing (POP) Plan in the area to focus on vehicle crime, burglaries and off-road bikes
- Introducing a new Sergeant to the team and implementing new ways of working to tackle ongoing issues

This area is high up on the agenda for the Neighbourhood Policing Team. The work being done in this area by SYP and the SNC includes:

- NAG meetings every 6 weeks to discuss key individuals
- Creating a Problem Orientated Policing (POP) Plan for the Newfield Green Shops area and doing targeted work around the sale of alcohol and links to ASB
 - Operations in place to look at theft of motor vehicles across the Valley
 - Working closely with the Gleadless Valley Masterplan Team around the redevelopment of the area and the links to crime and ASB.
- Introducing a new Sergeant to the team and implementing new ways of working to tackle ongoing issues
- Attending Gleadless Valley Partnership Meetings to make links with the local community

When to call 999

- •When there is a threat to life
- •Violence to a person or damage to property
- •A serious offence is actually in progress
- •A suspected offender is still at the scene of a crime
- •When any delay in reporting the incident may prevent the apprehension of an offender
- •When serious disruption to the public is currently taking place or, is likely to take place

When to call 101

- •To report a crime that is not currently taking place and the offender is no longer present
- Where your call is a routine enquiry
- •To make an appointment to attend an enquiry desk
- •Requests for advice or to provide information
- Lost and found property enquiries
