ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

A new Standards regime was introduced on 1st July, 2012 by the Localism Act 2011. The new regime made changes to the way that your interests needed to be registered and declared. Prejudicial and personal interests no longer exist and they have been replaced by Disclosable Pecuniary Interests (DPIs).

The Act also required that provision is made for interests which are not Disclosable Pecuniary Interests and required the Council to introduce a new local Code of Conduct for Members. Provision has been made in the new Code for dealing with "personal" interests.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously, and has been published on the Council's website as a downloadable document at -<http://councillors.sheffield.gov.uk/councillors/register-of-councillors-interests>

ADMISSIONS COMMITTEE

Meeting held 27th June 2012

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1. WELCOME AND HOUSEKEEPING ARRANGEMENTS

1.1 The Chair welcomed attendees to the meeting and outlined basic housekeeping and fire safety arrangements.

2. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

2.1 Apologies for absence were received from Councillors Alison Brelsford, Talib Hussain and Martin Lawton.

3. DECLARATIONS OF INTEREST

3.1 There were no declarations of interest.

4. MINUTES OF LAST MEETING

4.1 The minutes of the meeting of the Committee held on 31st May 2012, were approved as a correct record and, arising therefrom, it was noted that further to the decisions to defer consideration of three appeals relating to home to school travel bus passes, the Executive Director, Children, Young People and Families, had written to the pupils' parents requesting further information in connection with the cases, but to date, no such information had been received (Case Nos. Sil3, Sil4 and Sil5).

5. EXCLUSION OF THE PUBLIC AND PRESS

5.1 RESOLVED: That the public and press be excluded from the meeting before discussion takes place on the following items of business to be considered on the grounds that they contain exempt information described in paragraphs 1, 2 and 3 of Schedule 12A to the Local Government Act 1972, as amended.

6. ACTION TAKEN UNDER DELEGATED POWERS

6.1 The Committee noted that, since its last meeting, no decisions had been made by the Executive Director, Children, Young People and Families, in consultation with the Chair of the Committee, under powers delegated to her with regard to home to school transport or school admissions.

7. PRIMARY SCHOOL PLACES

7.1 *Request for Further Statutory Appeal Hearing*

7.1.1 The Executive Director, Children, Young People and Families, submitted a report and commented upon a case where parents had made a request for a further statutory appeal hearing on the grounds of changes in the family's circumstances and, arising therefrom, it was:-

7.1.2 RESOLVED: That the request be not granted on the grounds that the Committee considered that there has not been a material change in the family's circumstances (Case No. L1).

7.2 *Request for Prioritisation on the Waiting List*

7.2.1 The Executive Director, Children, Young People and Families, submitted a report and commented upon a case where parents had requested the City Council to give further consideration, as part of the 2012/13 Reception year group allocations process, to a request for their child to be prioritised on the waiting list, within their respective category, at the school of their choice and, arising therefrom, it was:-

7.2.2 RESOLVED: That, in the light of the supporting evidence provided, approval be given for the pupil to be prioritised first on the waiting list in the 'sibling' category at the school now mentioned (Case No. D1).

8. **SECONDARY SCHOOL PLACES**

8.1 *Request for Prioritisation on the Waiting List*

8.1.1 The Executive Director, Children, Young People and Families, submitted a report and commented upon a case where parents had requested the City Council to give further consideration to a request for their child to be prioritised on the waiting list, within their respective category, at the school of their choice and, arising therefrom, it was:-

8.1.2 RESOLVED: That, in the light of the supporting evidence provided, approval be given for the pupil to be prioritised first on the waiting list in the 'sibling' category at the school now mentioned (Case No. Tap1).

8.2 *Request for a Further Statutory Appeal Hearing*

8.2.1 The Executive Director, Children, Young People and Families, submitted a report and commented upon a case where parents had made a request for a further statutory appeal hearing on the grounds of changes in the family's circumstances and, arising therefrom, it was:-

8.2.2. RESOLVED: That the request be not granted on the grounds that the Committee considered that there has not been a material change in the family's circumstances (Case No. Tap2).

9. HOME TO SCHOOL TRANSPORT

9.1 The Executive Director, Children, Young People and Families, submitted reports and commented upon 30 cases where parents had appealed against the administrative decisions made by the Executive Director with regard to the refusal to grant home to school travel bus passes.

9.2 The Committee gave consideration to all the supporting information and evidence provided by the pupils' parents including, in some cases, evidence and advice provided by voluntary or professional bodies and organisations and, arising therefrom, it was:-

9.3 RESOLVED: That (a) nine appeals be upheld on the grounds that there are either exceptional educational, financial, medical or family circumstances in the cases (Case Nos. LO1, LO2, St.M1, HH2, HH3, HH4, NF2, NF3 and TA1), with the passes in the cases now mentioned being granted up to the end of the Academic Years as now stated;

(b) 20 appeals be not upheld on the grounds that there are no exceptional circumstances demonstrated and, having regard to the Council's Home to School Transport Policy, (i) the distance from the home addresses of four pupils to the schools for which they are requesting passes for is less than the distance in the criteria (Case Nos. St.C2, MH2, MH and ND2), (ii) the schools that five of the pupils are requesting passes for are not their catchment school/nearest suitable school (Case Nos. MB1, PY1, FH1, FH2 and OA1), (iii) 10 of the pupils do not attend one of their three nearest qualifying schools (Case Nos. PW1, Bir1, HG1, HH1, HS1, HS2, NH1, NF1, STO1 and BR1) and (iv) with regard to the remaining appeal, relating to a voluntary-aided school, the religious education provided at the school is not of the pupil's parents' religion or denomination (Case No. ND1); and

(c) consideration of the remaining appeal be deferred to enable the Executive Director, Children, Young People and Families, to seek further information in connection with the case (Case No. St.C1).
