ADVICE TO MEMBERS ON DECLARING INTERESTS AT MEETINGS

If you are present at a meeting of the Council, of its executive or any committee of the executive, or of any committee, sub-committee, joint committee, or joint sub-committee of the authority, and you have a **Disclosable Pecuniary Interest** (DPI) relating to any business that will be considered at the meeting, you must not:

- participate in any discussion of the business at the meeting, or if you become aware of your Disclosable Pecuniary Interest during the meeting, participate further in any discussion of the business, or
- participate in any vote or further vote taken on the matter at the meeting.

These prohibitions apply to any form of participation, including speaking as a member of the public.

You **must**:

- leave the room (in accordance with the Members' Code of Conduct)
- make a verbal declaration of the existence and nature of any DPI at any
 meeting at which you are present at which an item of business which affects or
 relates to the subject matter of that interest is under consideration, at or before
 the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes
 apparent.
- declare it to the meeting and notify the Council's Monitoring Officer within 28 days, if the DPI is not already registered.

If you have any of the following pecuniary interests, they are your **disclosable pecuniary interests** under the new national rules. You have a pecuniary interest if you, or your spouse or civil partner, have a pecuniary interest.

- Any employment, office, trade, profession or vocation carried on for profit or gain, which you, or your spouse or civil partner undertakes.
- Any payment or provision of any other financial benefit (other than from your council or authority) made or provided within the relevant period* in respect of any expenses incurred by you in carrying out duties as a member, or towards your election expenses. This includes any payment or financial benefit from a trade union within the meaning of the Trade Union and Labour Relations (Consolidation) Act 1992.

*The relevant period is the 12 months ending on the day when you tell the Monitoring Officer about your disclosable pecuniary interests.

- Any contract which is made between you, or your spouse or your civil partner (or a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest) and your council or authority –
 - under which goods or services are to be provided or works are to be executed; and
 - which has not been fully discharged.

- Any beneficial interest in land which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, have and which is within the area of your council or authority.
- Any licence (alone or jointly with others) which you, or your spouse or your civil
 partner, holds to occupy land in the area of your council or authority for a month
 or longer.
- Any tenancy where (to your knowledge)
 - the landlord is your council or authority; and
 - the tenant is a body in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest.
- Any beneficial interest which you, or your spouse or your civil partner has in securities of a body where -
 - (a) that body (to your knowledge) has a place of business or land in the area of your council or authority; and
 - (b) either -
 - the total nominal value of the securities exceeds £25,000 or one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that body; or
 - if the share capital of that body is of more than one class, the total nominal value of the shares of any one class in which you, or your spouse or your civil partner, has a beneficial interest exceeds one hundredth of the total issued share capital of that class.

If you attend a meeting at which any item of business is to be considered and you are aware that you have a **personal interest** in the matter which does not amount to a DPI, you must make verbal declaration of the existence and nature of that interest at or before the consideration of the item of business or as soon as the interest becomes apparent. You should leave the room if your continued presence is incompatible with the 7 Principles of Public Life (selflessness; integrity; objectivity; accountability; openness; honesty; and leadership).

You have a personal interest where -

- a decision in relation to that business might reasonably be regarded as affecting
 the well-being or financial standing (including interests in land and easements
 over land) of you or a member of your family or a person or an organisation with
 whom you have a close association to a greater extent than it would affect the
 majority of the Council Tax payers, ratepayers or inhabitants of the ward or
 electoral area for which you have been elected or otherwise of the Authority's
 administrative area, or
- it relates to or is likely to affect any of the interests that are defined as DPIs but are in respect of a member of your family (other than a partner) or a person with whom you have a close association.

Guidance on declarations of interest, incorporating regulations published by the Government in relation to Disclosable Pecuniary Interests, has been circulated to you previously.

You should identify any potential interest you may have relating to business to be considered at the meeting. This will help you and anyone that you ask for advice to fully consider all the circumstances before deciding what action you should take.

In certain circumstances the Council may grant a **dispensation** to permit a Member to take part in the business of the Authority even if the member has a Disclosable Pecuniary Interest relating to that business.

To obtain a dispensation, you must write to the Monitoring Officer at least 48 hours before the meeting in question, explaining why a dispensation is sought and desirable, and specifying the period of time for which it is sought. The Monitoring Officer may consult with the Independent Person or the Council's Audit and Standards Committee in relation to a request for dispensation.



1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the variation of a premises licence made under Section 34 of the Licensing Act 2003.

2.0 THE APPLICATION

- 2.1 The applicants are Charles Marks and Morgan Davies.
- 2.2 The application, which was received on 14th May 2019, is attached to this report labelled Appendix 'A'. Any blank pages have been omitted to save paper, but the original application will be available at the hearing. A copy of the full plan will be available at the hearing as it is too large and deteriorates on reduction.
- 2.3 A copy of the current Premises Licence is attached at Appendix 'B'.

3.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

- 3.1 A representation concerning the application has been received from the following and are attached at Appendix 'C':
 - 1 Responsible Authority Environmental Protection Service
- 3.2 The applicant and objector have been invited to attend the hearing. Copies of the front page of the notices are attached to this report labelled Appendix 'D'
- 3.3 Throughout the consultation, it was noted that the applicants did not apply to vary the hours for Recorded Music, yet advertised this as being included on the public notices at the premises and in the newspaper. Officers asked for this to be changed to reflect the correct requirement in the application, but this was never confirmed by the applicant within the consultation period, therefore Recorded Music is NOT for consideration within the remit of this Variation application, with timings remaining as they were prior to application.
- 3.4 The applicants have been advised that if they wish to vary the hours for Recorded Music, they will need to submit a further application to do this.

4.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

4.1 There are no specific financial implications arising from this application. However, additional costs may be incurred should the matter go to appeal. In such an eventuality it may not be possible to recover all these costs. The impact of these additional costs (if any) will be kept under review and may be subject of a further report during the year.

5.0 THE LEGAL POSITION

- 5.1 The Licensing Act 2003 at section 4 (1) requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives which section 4(2) sets out as:
 - a) the prevention of crime and disorder;
 - b) public safety:
 - c) the prevention of public nuisance;
 - d) the protection of children from harm.
- 5.2 Section 4(3) of the Licensing Act also requires the Licensing Authority to have regard to the published statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under section 182.

6.0 HEARING REGULATIONS

- 6.1 Regulations governing hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 have been made by the Secretary of State.
- 6.2 The Licensing Authority has provided all parties with the information required in the Regulations to the 2003 Act as set out at Appendix 'D'.
- 6.3 Attached at Appendix 'D' is the following:
 - a) a copy of the Notice of Hearing;
 - b) the rights of a party provided in Regulations 15 and 16;
 - c) the consequences if a party does not attend or is not represented at the hearing
 - d) the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

7.0 APPEALS

7.1 The Licensing Act 2003 section 181 and Schedule 5 makes provision for appeals to be made by the applicant and those making representations against decisions of the Licensing Authority to the Magistrates' Court.

8.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

8.1 That Members carefully consider the representations made and take such steps as the Sub-Committee consider appropriate for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

9.0 OPTIONS OPEN TO THE COMMITTEE

- 9.1 To vary the premises licence in the terms requested.
- 9.2 To vary the premises licence with conditions.
- 9.3 To reject the whole or part of the application.

As a licensed premises we know that it is necessary to carry out our functions or operate their businesses with a purpose of promoting these objectives. We promise to support these objectives through their operating schedules and other measures (including staff training and qualifications, policies, and strategic partnerships with other agencies).

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- CCTV System installed to monitor entrances, exits, and other parts of the premises in order to address the prevention of crime objective.
- Not selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.
- Prevention and vigilance in illegal drug use at the retail unit area.

c) Public safety

Internal and external lighting fixed to promote the public safety objective. Well trained staff adherence to environmental health requirements. Training and implementation of underage ID checks. A log book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises licence that requires the recording of such information. The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation. All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices, lighting, heating, electrical, air condition, sanitary accommodation and other installations, will be maintained at all times in good order and in a safe condition.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

Noise reduction measures to address the public nuisance objective. Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of nearby residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly. Deliveries of goods necessary for the operation of the business will be carried out at such a time or in such a manner as to prevent nuisance and disturbance to nearby residents. The Licensee will ensure that staff who arrive early morning or depart late at night (ex. for unpacking, pricing newly delivered goods) when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents. Customers will be asked not to stand around loudly talking in the street outside the premises. Customers will not be admitted to premises above opening hours. The movement of bins and rubbish outside the premises will be kept to a minimum after

11.00pm. This will help to reduce the levels of noise produced by the premises. Any lighting on or outside the premises will be positioned and screened in such a way so as to not cause a disturbance to nearby residents. Adequate waste receptacles for use by customers will be provided in the local vicinity.

e) The protection of children from harm

"Challenge 25" sign which is a retailing strategy that encourages anyone who is over 18 but looks under 25 to carry acceptable ID if they wish to buy alcohol. Well trained staff about requirement for persons' identification, age establishment etc.



Annex 1A - Mandatory Conditions

Mandatory Condition 1 (Section 19 ss 2)

Where a licence authorises the sale of alcohol then no supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence -

- (a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or
- (b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

Mandatory Condition 2 (Section 19 ss 3)

Where a licence authorises the sale of alcohol then every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

Mandatory Condition 3 (Section 20)

Mandatory Condition 4 (Section 21)

Where a premises licence includes a condition that at specified times one or more individuals must be at the premises to carry out a security activity each such individual must be licensed by the Security Industry Authority.

Annex 1B - Mandatory Condition effective from 28th May 2014:

- 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.
- 2. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-
 - (a) "duty" is to be construed in accordance with the Alcoholic Liquor Duties Act 1979;
 - (b) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

where-

- (i) P is the permitted price,

- (iii)V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;
- (c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-
 - (i) the holder of the premises licence,
 - (ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or
 - (iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;
- (d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question; and
- (e) "value added tax" means value added tax charged in accordance with the Value Added Tax Act 1994.

- 3. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.
- 4. (1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.
 - (2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 1C - Mandatory Conditions effective from 1st October 2014:

- 1.-(1) The responsible person must ensure that staff on relevant premises do not carry out, arrange or participate in any irresponsible promotions in relation to the premises.
 - (2) In this paragraph, an irresponsible promotion means any one or more of the following activities, or substantially similar activities, carried on for the purpose of encouraging the sale or supply of alcohol for consumption on the premises-
 - (a) games or other activities which require or encourage, or are designed to require or encourage, individuals to-
 - (i) drink a quantity of alcohol within a time limit (other than to drink alcohol sold or supplied on the premises before the cessation of the period in which the responsible person is authorised to sell or supply alcohol), or
 - (ii) drink as much alcohol as possible (whether within a time limit or otherwise);
 - (b) provision of unlimited or unspecified quantities of alcohol free or for a fixed or discounted fee to the public or to a group defined by a particular characteristic in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (c) provision of free or discounted alcohol or any other thing as a prize to encourage or reward the purchase and consumption of alcohol over a period of 24 hours or less in a manner which carries a significant risk of undermining a licensing objective;
 - (d) selling or supplying alcohol in association with promotional posters or flyers on, or in the vicinity of, the premises which can reasonably be considered to condone, encourage or glamorise anti-social **behaviour** or to refer to the effects of drunkenness in any favourable manner;
 - (e) dispensing alcohol directly by one person into the mouth of another (other than where that other person is unable to drink without assistance by reason of disability).
- 2. The responsible person must ensure that free potable water is provided on request to customers where it is reasonably available.
- 3.- (1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.
 - (2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.
 - (3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under
 - 18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before **being** served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-
 - (a) a holographic mark, or
 - (b) an ultraviolet feature.
- 4. The responsible person must ensure that-
 - (a) where any of the following alcoholic drinks is sold or supplied for consumption on the premises (other than alcoholic drinks sold or supplied having been made up in advance ready for sale or supply in a **securely** closed container) it is available to customers in the following measures-
 - (i) beer or cider: 1/2 pint;
 - (ii) gin, rum, vodka or whisky: 25 ml or 35 ml; and
 - (iii) still wine in a glass: 125 ml;
 - (b) these measures are displayed in a menu, price list or other printed material which is available to customers on the premises; and
 - (c) where a customer does not in relation to a sale of alcohol specify the quantity of alcohol to be sold, the customer is made aware that these measures are available.

ANNEX 2 - CONDITIONS CONSISTENT WITH THE OPERATING SCHEDULE

- 1. There shall be no adult entertainment or services, activities, other entertainment or matters ancillary to the use of the premises that may give rise to concern in respect of children.
- 2. The premises shall operate the 'Challenge 25' scheme and staff will be required to undertake ID checks as appropriate.
- 3. A CCTV system with recording option will be installed to monitor the entrances, exits and other parts of the premises.
- 4. No children will be allowed in the premsies after 5pm and all children are to be accompained and supervised by a responsible adult.
- 5. A refusals log book will be kept upon the premises at all times and shall be made available for **inspection** when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003.
- 6. Custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.
- 7. Prominent, clear and legible notices will be displayed at the exit requesting the public to respect the needs of local residents and to leave the premises and the area quietly.



This emailed representation is made in accordance with the agreement with the Licensing Authority on the 18th October 2006 to accept representations by email.

I have the following representation to make with regards to Public Nuisance for the application to vary the premises licence for the above premises.

The premises are located below residential accommodation and across the road from other dwellings, I am therefore concerned that nearby residents could potentially be affected by excessive noise disturbance from noise breaking out of the premises, noise transferring through the building and noise from people outside the venue in the late evening, and later than under current arrangements.

The application is seeking to increase the hours for regulated entertainment, and increase the time the premises are open to the public. To protect the nearby residential accommodation both above the premises and across the road, when the planning consent for a change of use was granted, the applicant was required to carry out a noise survey prior to the bar operating, so that the buildings ability to restrict the noise breaking out of the premises and also transferring through the building was quantified. There is also a requirement for a validation report to be produced to ensure the effectiveness of any works that have been carried out.

Unfortunately neither of these planning conditions have been discharged. This application is also to allow opening of the premises to the public for over an hour later on all days of the week than the 18/00641/FUL consent permits.

Had the noise report been produced it would have highlighted any issues with the buildings ability to retain sound, suggested suitable solutions and would also ensure that acceptable internal noise levels were maintained within nearby residential accommodation. Without the assurance a suitable noise survey and validation report would give it is not easy to quantify the impact of the proposed increase in licensable activity on the nearby residents.

I will therefore have to object to the application as it currently stands.

I would welcome the opportunity to discuss the matter further with the applicant.



Failure of parties to attend the hearing

- 20. (1) If a party has informed the authority that he does not intend to attend or be represented at a hearing, the hearing may proceed in his absence.
 - (2) If a party who has not so indicated fails to attend or be represented at a hearing the authority may:—
 - (a) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or
 - (b) hold the hearing in the party's absence.
 - (3) Where the authority holds the hearing in the absence of a party, the authority shall consider at the hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.
 - (4) Where the authority adjourns the hearing to a specified date it must forthwith notify the parties of the date, time and place to which the hearing has been adjourned.

Procedure at hearing

- 21. Subject to the provisions of the Regulations, the authority shall determine the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 22. At the beginning of the hearing, the authority shall explain to the parties the procedure which it proposes to follow at the hearing and shall consider any request made by a party under regulation 8(2) for permission for another person to appear at the hearing, such permission shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 23. A hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority and cross-examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considers that cross-examination is required for it to consider the representations, application or notice as the case may require.
- 24. The authority must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights provided for at regulation 16.
- 25. The authority may require any person attending the hearing who in their opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may
 - (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or
 - (b) permit him to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify, but such a person may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the authority in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

 - (f) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (g) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) may then be asked questions by members and with the leave of the Chair from the other parties present.
 - (h) The applicant will then be given the opportunity to sum up the application.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for members to take legal advice and consider the application.
- 6. The decision of the Licensing Committee will be given in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and regulations made there under.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - 2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a premises licence made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

2.0 THE APPLICATION

- 2.1 The applicant is Domo Restaurant Ltd.

Entitlement to work/immigration status for individual applicants and applications from partnerships which are not limited liability partnerships:

A licence may not be held by an individual or an individual in a partnership who is resident in the UK who:

- does not have the right to live and work in the UK; or
- is subject to a condition preventing him or her from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

Any premises licence issued in respect of an application made on or after 6 April 2017 will become invalid if the holder ceases to be entitled to work in the UK.

Applicants must demonstrate that they have an entitlement to work in the UK and are not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity. They do this in one of two ways: 1) by providing with this application copies or scanned copies of the documents listed below (which do not need to be certified), or 2) by providing their 'share code' to enable the licensing authority to carry out a check using the Home Office online right to work checking service (see below).

Documents which demonstrate entitlement to work in the UK

- An expired or current passport showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is A British citizen or a citizen of the UK and Colonies having the right of abode in the UK [please see note below about which sections of the passport to copy].
- An expired or current passport or national identity card showing the holder, or a person named in the passport as the child of the holder, is a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Registration Certificate or document certifying permanent residence issued by the Home Office to a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A Permanent Residence Card issued by the Home Office to the family member of a national of a European Economic Area country or Switzerland.
- A current Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder indicating that the person named is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** passport endorsed to show that the holder is exempt from immigration control, is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK, has the right of abode in the UK, or has no time limit on their stay in the UK.
- A **current** Immigration Status Document issued by the Home Office to the holder with an endorsement indicating that the named person is allowed to stay indefinitely in the UK or has no time limit on their stay in the UK, **when produced in combination with** an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK, when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A birth or adoption certificate issued in the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man or Ireland when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A certificate of registration or naturalisation as a British citizen, when produced in combination with an
 official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance number and their name issued by a
 Government agency or a previous employer.

- A current passport endorsed to show that the holder is allowed to stay in the UK and is currently allowed to
 work and is not subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a
 licensable activity.
- A **current** Biometric Immigration Document (Biometric Residence Permit) issued by the Home Office to the holder which indicates that the named person can currently stay in the UK and is allowed to work relation to the carrying on of a licensable activity.
- A **current** Residence Card issued by the Home Office to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights or residence.
- A current Immigration Status Document containing a photograph issued by the Home Office to the holder
 with an endorsement indicating that the named person may stay in the UK, and is allowed to work and is not
 subject to a condition preventing the holder from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity
 when produced in combination with an official document giving the person's permanent National Insurance
 number and their name issued by a Government agency or a previous employer.
- A Certificate of Application, **less than 6 months old**, issued by the Home Office under regulation 18(3) or 20(2) of the Immigration (European Economic Area) Regulations 2016, to a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence.
- Reasonable evidence that the person has an outstanding application to vary their permission to be in the UK with the Home Office such as the Home Office acknowledgement letter or proof of postage evidence, or reasonable evidence that the person has an appeal or administrative review pending on an immigration decision, such as an appeal or administrative review reference number.
- Reasonable evidence that a person who is not a national of a European Economic Area state or Switzerland but who is a family member of such a national or who has derivative rights of residence in exercising treaty rights in the UK including:-
 - evidence of the applicant's own identity such as a passport,
 - evidence of their relationship with the European Economic Area family member e.g. a marriage certificate, civil partnership certificate or birth certificate, and
 - evidence that the European Economic Area national has a right of permanent residence in the UK or is one of the following if they have been in the UK for more than 3 months:
 - (i) working e.g. employment contract, wage slips, letter from the employer,
 - (ii) self-employed e.g. contracts, invoices, or audited accounts with a bank,
 - (iii) studying e.g. letter from the school, college or university and evidence of sufficient funds; or
 - (iv) self-sufficient e.g. bank statements.

Family members of European Economic Area nationals who are studying or financially independent must also provide evidence that the European Economic Area national and any family members hold comprehensive sickness insurance in the UK. This can include a private medical insurance policy, an EHIC card or an S1, S2 or S3 form.

Original documents must not be sent to licensing authorities. If the document copied is a passport, a copy of the following pages should be provided:-

- (i) any page containing the holder's personal details including nationality;
- (ii) any page containing the holder's photograph;
- (iii) any page containing the holder's signature;
- (iv) any page containing the date of expiry; and
- (v) any page containing information indicating the holder has permission to enter or remain in the UK and is permitted to work.

If the document is not a passport, a copy of the whole document should be provided.

Your right to work will be checked as part of your licensing application and this could involve us checking your immigration status with the Home Office. We may otherwise share information with the Home Office. Your licence application will not be determined until you have complied with this guidance.

Home Office online right to work checking service

As an alternative to providing a copy of the documents listed above, applicants may demonstrate their right to work by allowing the licensing authority to carry out a check with the Home Office online right to work checking service.

To demonstrate their right to work via the Home Office online right to work checking service, applicants should include in this application their 9-digit share code (provided to them upon accessing the service at https://www.gov.uk/prove-right-to-work) which, along with the applicant's date of birth (provided within this application), will allow the licensing authority to carry out the check.

In order to establish the applicant's right to work, the check will need to indicate that the applicant is allowed to work in the United Kingdom and is not subject to a condition preventing them from doing work relating to the carrying on of a licensable activity.

An online check will not be possible in all circumstances because not all applicants will have an immigration status that can be checked online. The Home Office online right to work checking service sets out what information and/or documentation applicants will need in order to access the service. - Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.

 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.

 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - o any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - o any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.

I believe one of my neighbors in Little Kelham have been in touch with you regarding the outdoor seating, parking and noise issues with Domo which has recently opened in our estate. As I live in Little Kelham, and in very close proximity to Domo, I wanted to make comments regarding their application.

Whilst I think Domo is an excellent addition to Little Kelham, and I will certainly be supporting the restaurant, I have found since their opening there has been a lot of noise at night (11pm and sometimes later) by patrons drinking outside noisily and then leaving the estate loudly. This is during the week and weekends.

Staff are also emptying the bottles into the bins outside when we are trying to go to sleep late at night, again this is often at 11pm or later, which is incredibly frustrating. I feel this is something they could be doing in the morning when the restaurant opens at 8.30 am.

Parking within the estate has been a real issue. Cars are not permitted in Little Kelham and to gain access to a parking space we have had to pay £10,000 so I really don't appreciate the estate being full of cars! There have been issues with cars driving down the estate at more than 30 mph which has made the estate very anxious given there are a lot of children, cats and dogs who play. I am not sure that this will fall under your remit but just wanted to make the point so you are aware that this is happening.

The outdoor seating area is getting larger and larger which at times has made it difficult to get into my car parking space and also increases the amount of noise in the estate.

In summary, I think Domo is a great addition to Little Kelham, but their license should be the same as The Gatehouse at the bottom of the estate where patrons are not to permitted to sit outside after 7pm. The Gatehouse has not caused residents any issues.

I hope this email finds you well and that I have been given the correct address to send my concerns.

I would like to express my thoughts on the licensing arrangements for Domo restaurant at Little Kelham. Myself and many other residents are concerned that the outside seating space has far too much capacity and will also attract large crowds to congregate late at night in a densely occupied residential area.

Many neighbours have bedrooms at ground floor level adjoining the pedestrian streets around the estate.

Currently we have the gatehouse cafe at the entrance to Little Kelham who restrict the use of the outside area to a 7pm curfew. Myself and many of the residents feel this works really well and as such have a good relation with the owner. At the other end of Little Kelham we have the Stew and Oyster restaurant. It's outside space attracts very large crowds that quite often spill out beyond the boundary and far exceed the seating capacity. On a number of occasions, drunken and dissordily behaviour prevails and sometimes results in violent actions. The noise levels can be extremely high that effects the living standards for the residents who live just 1 floor above.

I would like to suggest that to continue the good spirit of Little Kelham and to ensure it continues to be welcoming to residents as well as the general public. That the outside licence for Domo is restricted to 7pm and its outside capacity to be reduced in line with the gatehouse capacity.

Having done a bit more digging, we have come to the conclusion that the outdoor seating area does not benefit from planning permission. Indicative seating was shown on the site plans associated with the original planning application (12/01401/FUL), however the approved site plan for the most recent Section 73 application (16/03102/FUL), i.e. the one under construction, does not show any provision for outdoor seating. Probably because it was not known which part of Eagle Works would be occupied by a restaurant use.

I intend to write to the restaurant (having already advised the landowner) to inform them of the need to submit an application for the provision of an outdoor seating area.

I would like to make it clear that we have no objection to the provision of an outdoor seating area adjacent the restaurant in principle. However, we would seek to define the extent of the seating area and would apply an hours of use condition designed to protect the amenities of the occupiers of neighbouring premises in the late evening. It should also be made clear that the outdoor seating area would be for diners as the unit only has an A3 (café/restaurant) which allows only ancillary drinking, i.e. it does not have consent for use as a bar.

I would therefore like to make formal representation raising significant concerns about the use of the proposed outdoor seating area in line with the opening hours requested.

Dear Mr Barrett.

We are writing to add our concerns to those of other Little Kelham residents over outdoor drinking outside the newly opened Domo restaurant in Eagle Works in the Little Kelham development in the evenings.

We wish to make it clear that we have no objections to the serving of alcohol on the premises but only with respect to the extent of the outside area and the times that this may be permitted. The restaurant is in the middle of a residential estate and some apartments are literally only a few metres from the front door of the premises.

As far as we are aware, no notices have been publicly displayed providing details of any licensing application.

Since opening, the restaurant has positioned around 20 tables well beyond the front elevation of the restaurant (my understanding is that two metres maximum is the norm) and over adjoining public highways. At least one deck chair and large bean bag is regularly positioned on the community boules court.

Drinking and eating has also been allowed in the communal outdoor spaces throughout the evening.

Cars and motorbikes are also regularly brought onto the estate and parked in the area adjoining the communal undercroft intended for residents and businesses of Little Kelham. Residents are not even allowed to to this as no public parking is permitted anywhere on the estate. It must be impressed upon Domo that it must ensure that its clients adhere to these restrictions.

Given the proximity of the residential units and restrictions placed on other similar establishments within the estate (The Gatehouse) surely you must accept that an 8pm restriction on outdoor drinking, possibly with an exception for occasional special event ie ones that are not habitual eg every Friday, Saturday or whenever, must be imposed.

As residents of Little Kelham we very much welcome the addition of businesses such as Domo but they will need to act responsibly if conflict with residents is not to occur due to homes and amenities being adversely affected by the issues detailed above.

I have been informed that i can email you my concerns regarding the Domo licensing.

I currently live a few doors from Domo, to be precise.

I wish to see a limit to the outside licensing, currently 7pm for the Gatehouse which is respectfully honored.

I have been perturbed by the lack of understanding and communication from Domo over several incidents which include parking outside for owners, staff and customers, with Domo not working with residents to resolve issues.

My points are manager and staff parking, parking attendant not giving tickets but clear signs stating a restriction in parking.

A motorbike race by 6 motorbikes, all customers of Domo, who lined up 2 at a time and raced from parking outside Domo to the arch at Gatehouse, at speeds which were astonishing. I spoke to staff who responded that this was out of their hands, in my opinion showing a complete lack of empathy for residents, their children or pets. I would point out it was their responsibility to tell them NOT to park outside Domo, this was clearly visable to them, secondly to remind patrons that this is a residential area, and lastly to acknowledge that this was a serious issue to people living at Little Kelham Street.

My last point is how many patrons show the upmost disregard for residents by peering into windows or into garages, this is not even done by accident but a blatent, we are passing and it is a right for us.



I am emailing, on behalf of my household, to put forward some our comments on the potential outdoor licensing for the new restaurant in the Little Kelham development, Domo.

We are residents of the Little Kelham development and our house is approximately 10m from the restaurant. The current outdoor seating area of Domo has been utilised nearly every evening since they opened around a fortnight ago, and is very busy on Friday and Saturday nights. Patrons seem to be able to continue to drink alcohol in the outdoor space until the restaurant closes. As you might expect given the time of year, we have been having our windows open nearly continuously and the noise levels from the outside seating area have been rather intrusive, especially when it is busier. The patrons are also noisy when they leave the restaurant and walk to the entrance to the development past our house.

We also have concerns over the size of the current outdoor seating area - it is arranged all around the boules court and would restrict proper access to this if the seating area remained the same, residents are currently unable to use this due to the current stage of the building work.

We also have concerns relating to parking. Patrons have been parking near the restaurant, within the development, despite multiple signs stating that there is no parking allowed on the communal spaces of the development (excluding emergency vehicles). There was an incident recently where some people drove down Little Kelham Street, out of the development, on motorbikes very quickly - there are many children and pets living here and reckless driving poses a danger to them, as well as to the adults to a lesser extent. Parking officers do patrol but we think it would be reasonable for Domo to also take responsibility to ensure their patrons follow the restrictions.

Our last concern relates to smoking although we don't know if anything can be done about this. When people smoke outside there are times when we can smell it coming through our windows of our living space, which is on the 2nd floor.





Right of attendance, assistance and representation



15. Subject to regulations 14(2) and 25, a party may attend the hearing and may be assisted or represented by any person whether or not that person is legally qualified.

Representations and supporting information

- 16. At the hearing a party shall be entitled to
 - (a) in response to a point upon which the authority has given notice to a party that it will want clarification under regulation 7(1)(d), give further information in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable),
 - (b) if given permission by the authority, question any other party; and
 - (c) address the authority

Failure of parties to attend the hearing

- 20. (1) If a party has informed the authority that he does not intend to attend or be represented at a hearing, the hearing may proceed in his absence.
 - (2) If a party who has not so indicated fails to attend or be represented at a hearing the authority may:—
 - (a) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or
 - (b) hold the hearing in the party's absence.
 - (3) Where the authority holds the hearing in the absence of a party, the authority shall consider at the hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.
 - (4) Where the authority adjourns the hearing to a specified date it must forthwith notify the parties of the date, time and place to which the hearing has been adjourned.

Procedure at hearing

- 21. Subject to the provisions of the Regulations, the authority shall determine the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 22. At the beginning of the hearing, the authority shall explain to the parties the procedure which it proposes to follow at the hearing and shall consider any request made by a party under regulation 8(2) for permission for another person to appear at the hearing, such permission shall not be unreasonably withheld.
- 23. A hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority and cross-examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considers that cross-examination is required for it to consider the representations, application or notice as the case may require.
- 24. The authority must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights provided for at regulation 16.
- 25. The authority may require any person attending the hearing who in their opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may
 - (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or
 - (b) permit him to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify, but such a person may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the authority in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

<u>Licensing Act 2003 – Hearing Procedure – Regulation 7 (1)</u>

This procedure has been drawn up in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 to assist those parties attending Licensing Committee hearings.

- 1. The hearing before the Council is Quasi Judicial.
- 2. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
- 3. The Chair will ask the applicants to formally introduce themselves.
- 4. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 5. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
 - (c) The Licensing Officer will introduce in turn representatives for the Responsible Authority and Interested Parties who will be asked to detail their relevant representations.
 - (d) Members may ask questions of those parties
 - (e) With the leave of the Chair the applicant or his representative may cross examine the representatives of the Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties.
 - (f) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
 - (i) detail the application;
 - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
 - (g) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) may then be asked questions by members and with the leave of the Chair from the other parties present.
 - (h) The applicant will then be given the opportunity to sum up the application.
 - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (j) There will then be a private session for members to take legal advice and consider the application.
- 6. The decision of the Licensing Committee will be given in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and regulations made there under.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.

Could you please now ensure that, in addition to the removal of regulated entertainments as previously agreed, the following four volunteered conditions are also included on any licence issued for the above premises, as agreed below;

The premises shall operate as a restaurant only, and the provision of alcohol shall be primarily with the provision of food or, on a limited basis, in the indoor bar area for diners awaiting a table. Alcohol provision on the outside terrace shall at all times be strictly in conjunction with seated dining only, and ancillary to the provision of a meal in all cases.

- Customer use of the outside terrace dining area shall cease at 2100 hours on all days. Outdoor furniture shall then be cleared away or secured in such a manner as to prevent subsequent unauthorised use.
- The Designated Premises Supervisor or a delegated member of staff shall take a pro-active approach to noise control, checking outside the premises to ensure that the breakout of internal noise and noise from patrons using the external areas and departing the premises is managed so as not to cause a nuisance to occupiers of nearby residential properties.
