Premier Stores, 28-30 Ballifield Drive, Sheffield, S13 9HS

1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the review of a premises licence made under Section 51 of the Licensing Act 2003 in relation to Premier Stores, 28-30 Ballifield Drive, Sheffield, S13 9HS.

2.0 THE APPLICATION

2.1 The application is made by South Yorkshire Police and was received by the Licensing Service on 4th December 2015.

2.2 The grounds for the review are based on the following aspects of the 2003 Licensing Act objectives:-

- Prevention of Public Nuisance
- Protection of Children from harm.

2.3 The application form is attached at Appendix 'A' and details further the grounds for the review application.

3.0 REASONS FOR REFERRAL

3.1 The Licensing Authority must under the Act refer any application for review to the Licensing Committee, unless it is withdrawn, or if representations are made by an interested party that the Licensing Authority are of the opinion that they are frivolous or vexatious.

3.2 The Licensing Authority has, during the representation period received representations from the following:-

- a) Sheffield Safeguarding Children's Board Appendix 'B'

3.3 The applicant, the Premises Licence Holder and any other person that has made representations have been invited to attend the hearing. Copies of the front page of the notices are attached to this report labelled Appendix 'C'.

4.0 FINANCIAL IMPLICATIONS

- 4.1 There are no specific financial implications arising from this application. However additional costs may be incurred should the matter go to appeal. In such an eventuality it may not be possible to recover all these costs. The impact of these additional costs (if any) will be kept under review and may be subject of a further report during the year.

5.0 THE LEGAL POSITION

- 5.1 The Licensing Act 2003 at section 52(3) requires that the Licensing Authority must, having regard to the application and any relevant representations, take such steps mentioned in subsection (4) (if any) as it considers necessary for the promotion of the licensing objectives.

- 5.2 Section 52(4) states:

"The steps are –

- a) To modify the conditions of the licence;
- b) To exclude the licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
- c) To remove the designated premises supervisor;
- d) To suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
- e) To revoke the licence;

and for this purpose the conditions of the licence are modified if any of them is altered or omitted, or any new condition added."

- 5.3 If members decide to take the steps referred to in (a) or (b) above, it may provide that the modification or exclusion is to have effect for only such period (not exceeding three months) as it may specify.

- 5.4 The Licensing Act 2003 at section 52(11) states that:

"A determination under this section does not have effect –

- a) until the end of the period given for appealing against the decision, or
- b) if the decision is appealed against, until the appeal is disposed of."

- 5.5 The Licensing Act 2003 at section 4(1) requires the Licensing Authority to carry out its functions with a view to promoting the Licensing Objectives which section 4(2) sets out as: -

- a) the prevention of crime and disorder,
- b) public safety,
- c) the prevention of public nuisance,
- d) the protection of children from harm.

- 5.6 Section 4(3) of the Licensing Act also requires the Licensing Authority to have regard to the published Statement of Licensing Policy and any guidance issued by the Secretary of State under Section 182.

6.0 HEARINGS REGULATIONS

- 6.1 Regulations governing hearings under the Licensing Act 2003 have been made by the Secretary of State.
- 6.2 The Licensing Authority has provided all parties with the information required in the Regulations to the 2003 Act as set out at Appendix 'D'.
- 6.3 Attached at Appendix 'D' is the following: -
- a) a copy of the Notice of Hearing;
 - b) the rights of a party provided in Regulations 15 and 16;
 - c) the consequences if a party does not attend or is not represented at the hearing
 - d) the procedure to be followed at the hearing.

7.0 APPEALS

- 7.1 The Licensing Act 2003 section 181 and Schedule 5 makes provision for appeals to be made by the applicant; the holder of the premises licence and those making representations against decisions of the Licensing Authority to the Magistrates Court.

8.0 RECOMMENDATIONS

- 8.1 That members carefully consider the application for review along with any other representations made and take such steps as detailed in paragraph 5.2 above that the Committee consider necessary for the promotion of the Licensing Objectives.

9.0 OPTIONS OPEN TO THE COMMITTEE

- 9.1
- a) modify the conditions of the licence;
 - b) exclude a licensable activity from the scope of the licence;
 - c) remove the designated premises supervisor;
 - d) suspend the licence for a period not exceeding three months;
 - e) revoke the licence; or
 - f) reject the application for review.

Protection of Children from Harm

Premier Stores, 28-30 Ballifield Drive, Handsworth, Sheffield, S13 9HS was issued with a Premises License No SY 1847 PR on the 1st June 2009. The Premises License Holder is shown as Hardeep Singh Matto and Designated Premise Supervisor is shown as Jugdeep Singh.

The premises have been subject of recent Test Purchase Operations. Since 27th November 2014 it has failed the test three times and passed the test three times. Full details of these test purchase operations are contained within this report.

These test purchase operations are conducted to provide a positive response and action following complaints from the public and observations by police staff that many instances of anti-social behaviour involve young people under the age of 18 years, who have acquired alcohol and/or under the influence of alcohol.

Many instances of concern by local residents relate to shopping precincts, park areas and other similar hotspots, which suffer from graffiti, criminal damage and threatening behaviour by these young people towards other law abiding members of the public.

The issue of child safety is also raised, in that alcohol acquired by young people illegally is often passed to even younger children and over indulged by all, thereby causing serious concern for health and safety.

Test Purchase and Intervention carried out at the premises:-

1. Thursday 27th November 2014
Four x 500ml cans Stella 4% lager was sold to a 15 year old police volunteer , by a member of staff namely, Jessica SHARPE.

A Fixed Penalty Notice No. 0031404 8 was issued attracting a penalty of £90.

A failed Test Purchase Pack was sent out on 16th December 2014. This pack is full of useful information and best practices on how best to avoid under age sales and advise on safeguarding young people.

2. On Saturday 13th December 2014 the premises passed a Test Purchase Operation.
3. On Saturday 10th January 2015 the premises passed a Test Purchase Operation.
4. On Friday 13th February 2015 the premises passed a Test Purchase Operation.
5. Thursday 12th March 2015
One x Bottle of Jacques Cider was sold to a 15 year old police volunteer, by a member of staff namely, Emma FAIRBROTHER.

A Fixed Penalty Notice No. 0013508 9 was issued attracting a penalty of £90.

A meeting was held on Thursday 19th March 2015 to discuss the Failed Test Purchase. Present at the meeting was the Designated Premises Supervisor Mr Singh, SYP Licensing Enforcement Officer Lizzy Payne and SYP Licensing Administrator, Alicia Marsden. They spoke with him for a considerable amount of time regarding the failure. Another Licensing/Safeguarding Information pack was provided to assist Mr Singh in training his staff. All areas of due diligence were discussed and explained the need to retrain staff in light of this failure. The legislation was explained to Mr Singh regarding what would happen should the shop fail twice in a three month period (voluntary closure) and if the shop fails three times in twelve months (Review of the license). It was recommended that Mr Singh send some of his staff on a Multi Agency Training course as a refresher.

6. On Wednesday 14th October 2015 several of the staff from the shop attended a Multi Agency Training course. This was led by Julie Hague, Childrens Safeguarding Board. Also speaking at the training was Benita Mumby, SYP Licensing Manager and Greg Ward, Trading Standards.
7. Wednesday 4th November 2015
1 x Bottle of Crabbies Alcoholic Ginger Beer was sold to a 15 year old police volunteer, by a member of staff namely, Jessica SHARPE.

A Fixed Penalty Notice No. 0034470 was issued attracting a penalty of £90.





I am a police inspector currently responsible for the South East Sheffield Local Policing Team which includes the Ballified estate, Sheffield. I have performed this role since 2009 and have a good overview of local issues within my area.

My primary functions are problem solving around quality of life issues, community safety, and responding to long term problems within the community either as a partnership with other interested agencies, or as a stand-alone police service. In doing this I consult with the community, speak to my partners and ensure that lines of communication are open between South Yorkshire Police and those who represent the communities. I am also looking to ensure opportunities are taken to reduce crime from occurring in the first instance through preventative measures and interventions to ensure the community feels safe.

The issue of alcohol and its effect on behaviour is taken very seriously across my entire geographic area in the South East of Sheffield. Indeed Woodhouse for example was the first residential area within Sheffield to obtain a Designated Public Place Order (DPPO) which ensures that people are not allowed to congregate within public areas and consume alcohol.



I can confirm that the effect of alcohol on young people is very detrimental not only to the young people themselves, but also the local community which is why, as an area, we place great emphasis on the importance of carrying out regular Test Purchase Operations. These are done with the aim of identifying premises who do not have stringent procedures and policies in place, which in turn ensure they are only selling alcohol to over 18s responsibly. Once identified we work with local partner agencies to offer support, advice and training to try and reduce the possibility of these premises committing the offence of underage sales again.

My enquiries have shown that Premier Stores Ballfield Road have failed two further test purchase operations since the initial failure on 21st November 2014. The premises have also passed three operations during this time. However I have genuine concerns with regards to the management of the premise and I am aware that licensing staff have met with them previously to highlight this along with arranging additional training.

As stated above the effects of alcohol on young people can lead to an increase in Anti-Social and criminal behaviour which negatively impacts on the local community. Therefore, I am keen to ensure that premises such as Premier Stores are made aware of the impact of their failure to prevent sales to underage people, and that in future they take all reasonable steps available to ensure that this does not happen again.

A colour CCTV system to the specification of South Yorkshire Police, will be fitted, maintained and in use at all times the premises are open, the CCTV images will be stored for 28 days and Police and Authorised Officers of the Council will be given access to images for purposes in connection with the prevention and detection of crime and disorder.
2. The Premises Licence Holder and all persons working at the premises shall be fully trained in the use of the CCTV system in order that images can be immediately obtained by Police and Authorised Officers of the Council.
3. The CCTV system to be extended outside the premises to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority to provide two CCTV cameras to the front and one to cover the rear back yard of the premises.
4. Additional lighting to be fitted to the front and rear of the premises, sufficient to enable clear images of persons to be recorded by CCTV.
5. The sale of alcohol to be limited to the floor space as per the plan submitted at the hearing and agreed with the applicant.
6. A mosquito style system to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority must be installed and maintained and available for use at all times that the premises are open to the public.
7. The Challenge 21 proof of age Scheme promoted by the Government must be operated at all times at the premises and must include the use of a refusals book.
8. All staff and the Premises Licence Holder shall be trained in the operation of the Challenge 21 Scheme and how to manage confrontation, and staff training records must be maintained to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority and made available to officers of the Responsible Authorities and the Licensing Authority on request.
9. The holder of a Personal Licence to remain on the premises at all times that the premises are open and alcohol sold.
10. A till prompt be installed to remind each member of staff to check the identity of customers if they suspect them to be under the age of 21.
11. The Premises Licence Holder and the Designated Premises Supervisor shall be members of Sheffield Licence Watch and maintain registration, annual membership and attendance at appropriate meetings.

I am writing to make a representation on behalf of the Safeguarding Children Board (SSCB) as the Responsible Authority for the protection of children from harm under the Licensing Act 2003. The reason for the representation is that the above premise has been evidenced to operate in a way that has put children at risk and undermines the core objective for the protection of children from harm, under the Licensing Act 2003.

The evidence submitted by South Yorkshire Police demonstrates that alcohol has been sold to children at the premises on 3 occasions within a 12 month period. The Safeguarding Children Board takes a serious view of premises that are evidenced to be selling alcohol to children. The SSCB routinely offers training sessions to people in the licensed trade to ensure they are fully aware of the risks associated with underage sales and that Designated Premises Supervisors, licence holders and their staff are able to manage risk for the prevention of harm to children.

In November 2014, the Safeguarding Children Board was informed by South Yorkshire Police that the premises had failed a test purchase operation resulting in a 15 year old child buying lager from the shop. In response, free training places were offered to the licence holder (appendix 1 a, refers). This resulted in two staff from the shop attending the training on 4.2.15.

In March, the Safeguarding Children Board was again notified by the police that another 15 year old child had been able to buy alcohol (cider) during a test purchase operation at the shop, this resulted in the Safeguarding Children Board offering further training places (appendix 1 b refers), however no staff from the premise attended the training that took place on 15.4.15.

In September 2015, the licence holder Mr Singh contacted the Safeguarding Children Board and requested 7 places on the next available training (app 1 c). These were provided and on 14.10.15 six staff attended the training.

The training provided in response to failed test purchase operations or other complaints is a strategy that has been agreed by the South Yorkshire Police, the Safeguarding Children Board and Trading Standards and is set out in South Yorkshire Police's 'Test Purchase Protocol'; the aim of this is to engage retailers in partnership to support them to improve their operation to make it safe and compliant with the law. The training has been recognised by the Licensing Authority since 2008 and does not usually result in operators repeatedly returning due to failing 3 test purchase operations within a 12 month period. The training provides information about the law in relation to children and alcohol, how an operator can prevent underage sales and the impact of underage drinking on children and young people and the local community.


It is with some disappointment therefore, that despite Mr Singh's apparent willingness to send staff on the training, there is evidence of a 'hit and miss' trend in the enforcement of the due diligence systems to prevent underage sales. On 7.11.15, I was notified by the police that a 15 year old child had bought alcohol from the premises during a test purchase operation on 4.11.15.

The impact of alcohol misuse on children is well documented and the prevention of underage sales is a key objective of local and national alcohol strategies. This is because underage drinking can significantly impact on a child's health and physical development, education, behaviour and personal safety.

The Safeguarding Children Board is concerned that, despite a number of staff attending the training, the premises management has failed to consistently enforce the required system or improve the operation at the premises.

In light of the above, the Safeguarding Children Board would ask the Licensing Sub Committee to take positive action to address the serious safeguarding concerns presenting at this premise.

NOTES

Right of attendance, assistance and representation

15. Subject to regulations 14(2) and 25, a party may attend the hearing and may be assisted or represented by any person whether or not that person is legally qualified.

Representations and supporting information

16. At the hearing a party shall be entitled to –
 - (a) in response to a point upon which the authority has given notice to a party that it will want clarification under regulation 7(1)(d), give further information in support of their application, representations or notice (as applicable),
 - (b) if given permission by the authority, question any other party; and
 - (c) address the authority

Failure of parties to attend the hearing

20. –
 - (1) If a party has informed the authority that he does not intend to attend or be represented at a hearing, the hearing may proceed in his absence.
 - (2) If a party who has not so indicated fails to attend or be represented at a hearing the authority may:–
 - (a) where it considers it to be necessary in the public interest, adjourn the hearing to a specified date, or
 - (b) hold the hearing in the party's absence.
 - (3) Where the authority holds the hearing in the absence of a party, the authority shall consider at the hearing the application, representations or notice made by that party.
 - (4) Where the authority adjourns the hearing to a specified date it must forthwith notify the parties of the date, time and place to which the hearing has been adjourned.

Procedure at hearing

21. Subject to the provisions of the Regulations, the authority shall determine the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
22. At the beginning of the hearing, the authority shall explain to the parties the procedure which it proposes to follow at the hearing and shall consider any request made by a party under regulation 8(2) for permission for another person to appear at the hearing, such permission shall not be unreasonably withheld.
23. A hearing shall take the form of a discussion led by the authority and cross-examination shall not be permitted unless the authority considers that cross-examination is required for it to consider the representations, application or notice as the case may require.
24. The authority must allow the parties an equal maximum period of time in which to exercise their rights provided for at regulation 16.
25. The authority may require any person attending the hearing who in their opinion is behaving in a disruptive manner to leave the hearing and may –
 - (a) refuse to permit that person to return, or
 - (b) permit him to return only on such conditions as the authority may specify, but such a person may, before the end of the hearing, submit to the authority in writing any information which they would have been entitled to give orally had they not been required to leave.

Appendix D

Regulations / Procedures

Licensing Act 2003 – Hearing Procedure (REVIEW) – Regulation 7 (1)

This procedure has been drawn up in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 to assist those parties attending Licensing Committee hearings.

1. The hearing before the Council is Quasi Judicial.
 2. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
 3. The Chair will ask the applicants and other parties to formally introduce themselves.
 4. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
 5. Hearing Procedure:-
 - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
 - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked by Members the applicant and other parties.
 - (c) The Licensing Officer will introduce the applicant for review (or his/her nominated representative) who will be asked to detail the application.
 - (d) Members may ask questions.
 - (e) The Licensing Officer will in turn introduce representatives for the other Responsible Authorities and Interested parties who will be asked to detail their relevant representations
 - (f) Members may ask questions
 - (g) With the leave of the Chair the licensee or his representative may cross examine the representatives of the applicant for review and the other Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties.
 - (h) The licensee (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to respond to the application and to any other representations made.
 - (i) The licensee (or his/her nominated representative) may then be asked questions by members and with the leave of the Chair from the other parties present.
 - (j) The applicant will then be given the opportunity to sum up the application.
 - (k) The representatives of the Responsible Authorities will be given the opportunity to sum up
 - (l) The licensee will be given the opportunity to sum up
 - (m) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
 - (n) There will then be a private session for members to take legal advice and consider the application.
 6. The decision of the Licensing Committee will be given in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and regulations made there under.
- NB:
- 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
 - 2) The Board Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.

Regulation 8

- (1) A party shall give to the authority within the period of time provided for in the following provisions of this regulation a notice stating –
 - (a) whether he intends to attend or be represented at the hearing;
 - (b) whether he considers a hearing to be unnecessary
- (2) In a case where a party wishes any other person (other than the person he intends to represent him at the hearing) to appear at the hearing, the notice referred to in paragraph (1) shall contain a request for permission for such other person to appear at the hearing accompanied by details of the name of that person and a brief description of the point or points on which that person may be able to assist the authority in relation to the application, representations or notice of the party making the request.
- (3) In the case of a hearing under –
 - (a) section 48(3)(a) (cancellation of interim authority notice following police objection), or
 - (b) section 105(2)(a) (counter notice following police objection to temporary event notice),

the party shall give the notice no later than one working day before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

- (4) In the case of a hearing under –
 - (a) section 167(5)(a) (review of premises licence following closure order),
 - (b) paragraph 4(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing licence), paragraph 16(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing club certificate)
 - (c) paragraph 26(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application by holder of justices' licence for grant of personal licence),

the party shall give the notice no later than two working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

- (5) In any other case, the party shall give the notice no later than five working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

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
