NOTES FOR THE INTERVIEWER

THE GROUNDS FOR REGISTRATION OF A TOWN OR VILLAGE GREEN

Commons Act 2006 section 15, Registration of greens

- (1) Any person may apply to the commons registration authority to register land to which the Part ie part 1 of the Commons Act 2006, registration applies as a town or village green in a case where subsection (2), (3) or (4) applies.
- (2) This subsection applies where -
 - (a) a significant number of the inhabitants of any locality, or of any neighbourhood within a locality, have indulged as of right in lawful sports and pastimes on the land for a period of at least 20 years; and
 - (b) they continue to do so at the time of application.
- (3) This subsection applies where -
 - (a) a significant number of the inhabitants of any locality, or of any neighbourhood within a locality, indulged as of right in lawful sports and pastimes on the land for a period of at least 20 years;
 - (b) they ceased to do so before the time of the application but after the commencement of this section; and
 - (c) the application is made within the period of two years beginning with the cessation referred to in paragraph (b).
- (4) This subsection applies (subject to subsection (5), where
 - (a) a significant number of the inhabitants of any locality, or of any neighbourhood within a locality, indulged as of right in lawful sports and pastimes on the land for a period of at least 20 years;
 - (b) they ceased to do so before the commencement of this section; and
 - (c) the application is made within the period of five years beginning with the cessation referred to in paragraph (b).



WALKLEY WALK

- Walkley Library built 1905 to the design of H.L. Paterson and paid for by Andrew Carnegie. Instigated by Councillor Crowther (see memorial plaques).
 - In 1790 we would have been beside Walkley Lane on the edge of Walkley Bank Common. Behind us Palmer Crofts and the lands of Joseph Clay. In front, at the bottom of the steep bank, is Parsonage Farm, now bisected by Parsonage Crescent. These lands, down to the River Loxley, belonged to the Duke of Norfolk. The steepest nort remained common land and was used for roads, rough grazing and public stone quaries.
- 2. Upper Walkley. Heavygate Road, Walkley Road, Bole Hill Road and Rivelin Street are ancient highways and this is the centre of the earliest known part of the village. Look at Camm Street and compare your 1790 map. The Cam is the name for the upper limit of cultivation and we can speculate that the medieval fields stretched up as far as this. Stubbings are usually later enclosures from woodlands. The earliest settlement may have been on either side of Orchard Road, which later became the tannery. Ruins of a large timber framed building could be seen till the 1960s. Opposite, the ancestor of the Cottage existed in 1554 and was mentioned in Queen Mary's charter to the Church Burgesses, who owned it. Beyond it was Hides Farm and some cottages. Immediately behind us was Walkley Hall built about 1600 by Edward Rawson who came to take over the tannery. The house was a safe distance away from the tannery and wisely upwind. It was quite an imposing mansion with gabled dormers. In the 18th century hall and tannery passed to the Birks and when they sold it the hall and tannery were parted. The hall was bought by Jonathan Hague, cutler and steel merchant. By this time the main building had developed various attachments housing cutlery outworkers. In 1797 Hague went bankrupt and the hall became a small farm. Sheffield Corporation acquired the land in 1919 for a housing estate and in 1927 built a further ten houses by knocking down the hall.
- 3. We're on the village green (still in 1790). Down Rivelin Street ran the Racker Way to Stannington, Moscar, Derwent and Glossop. Walkley Bank (anciently Pegham Bank) was part of Rivelin Chase, and until about 1680 deer used to have a free run through Walkley to Rawson Spring Wood, Old Park Wood and Scraith Wood as far as Southey. Up to about 1900 the lads of Scotland Street came every year on May Day morning to gather birch shoots to decorate their street.

Across the street, Bole Hill Schools from a later period of development: 1896 for Sheffield School Board by W.J. Hale, "a free renaissance freely treated". The separate levels were used to segregate the sexes. The cupola typical of this period.

Before us, Ruskin House. Ruskin was interested in Sheffield because it was a place where craftsmanship survived and it was near beautiful countryside. He was particularly interested in Walkley because his friend and disciple Henry Swan lived there. In 1875 he purchased a five room cottage for the Museum of the Guild of St George, together with surrounding land up to about 1 acre. Henry Swan occupied four rooms, the other (13' square) was the museum. It contained mineral and geological specimens, copies of paintings, photographs of architecture, manuscripts and beautiful books and could accommodate about two people at once. The house was said to resemble "the residence of a country

school master, square, grey, bleak and ugly". Ruskin was not out to attract the masses. But Prince Leopold came in 1879 and William Morris in 1885, and extensions had to be built in 1878 and 1885, the latter for Bunney's great picture of St Mark's, Venice. Swan died in 1889 and the museum moved to Meersbrook.

The present appearance largely dates from 1890 when it was converted, with Ruskin's approval, into a girls' home.

4. Bell Hagg Road. Looking up by number 85 Bell Hagg Road we can see the original front of the Museum House, with its distinctive hood mouldings to the windows. An extra storey has been added.

Now it is time to consider the development of 19th Century Walkley. Ruskin's disciple, Benjamin Creswick wrote:

"a house stands next to the Museum, fronting Bell Hagg Road. The bricks of that house were made of clay dug out of the ground upon which the house stands and were made by the two sons; they were successfully burnt by the two sons. The house was built and completed without aid of any kind by the father and the two sons. They planted and grew various crops of grain, oats, wheat and vegetables etc. and practically trained themselves into farmers. They ultimately entered on a farm of 14 acres at Bradfield and worked the same successfully. These people were scissor-forgers and did these things when trade was bad for them and in their leisure hours".

This was the ideal of the Freehold Land Society. It is a pity that this house has gone, but we can see many similar, though mostly, at this end of Walkley, built in stone. The Bole Hill quarries, and other smaller ones, were a godsend.

We are now standing in the estate of the Rivelin View Land Society, established December 1853, 222 lots of 32 acres, formerly belonging to the Duke of Norfolk, excluding the Cottage Inn and Parsonage Farm. The Societies paid for the land in annual instalments raised from members' weekly subscriptions. Members could work their allotments and build houses on them of any style they wanted. When their subscriptions were fully paid up they became entitled to a vote for the West Riding County Constituency, Hall Carr and Birkendale were the first Freehold Land Society estates in Sheffield. The Walkley Society was formed in 1849 and saw itself as distinctly working class: "formed by working men and for their own benefit solely". Houses at Birkendale cost £80 upwards; Walkley houses were expected to cost £10 less, partly because stone was closer at hand.

The Rivelin View estate was comparatively modest by Walkley standards. However, some builders have proudly and helpfully inscribed their initials and the date of building.

5. Walkley Crescent Road. Illustrates the development of a freehold land society. The more makeshift early houses have gone, but many plots were unbuilt upon before the 1880s. A real problem of the societies was lack of drainage, and Walkley Crescent Road paid the price of being relatively level. In 1852 the Sanitary Inspector reported:

"Some idea of the quantity of water collected on Walkley Crescent Road will be gathered when I state that a flock of ducks had taken possession

of the miniature lake and were sailing to and fro and appeared to be spending a most enjoyable day. House no.160, which occupies a position close to this pool, and stands considerably below the level of the road, I found to be in shocking condition. The flood water which should be dealt with by sewers has drained through the foundation walls of the house and was passing in a stream through the pantry and living room, leaving behind a most offensive smell."

So, the Corporation insisted on sewers, and the occupiers had to pay. To raise the cash, they sold off their frontages, if they had had enough foresight to build at the back, or they sold out altogether to speculators, and terraces, stone and later brick, result. Note all these phases, in particular:

- 170 House at bottom of plot
- 150 Rose Hill Cottage
- 144 G.T.R. Rivling View 1868. Single room thick, wide gable, good light for attic
- 109 Typical Sheffield back-to-back proportions
- 100 Corner shop/beer-off. c.1900. Few such facilities were provided on the original estate
- 90 No trace of building ever having been attached
- 62/4 T.E. Greno View. 1867 built as a pair

Armthorpe Cottage 1858, pair; note roofs at back

Crescent Cottage 1854; the earliest survivor? Original porch was like Old Park View (opposite)

Southey Cottage 1855 on Walkley Bank Road of same type in almost original condition

6. Lower Walkley. Developed in late eighteenth century at the bottom of the common. File cutters, penknife makers, small farmers. Also included:

Springfield House, owned by Bradshaw family, cutlers. Small late Georgian attached house similar to later estate "cottages".

George Collier's school. First appearance of Church of England in Walkley. George Collier was a cutler who retired to Walkley for health reasons and ran a voluntary school. He died in 1833, Stony Walk, probably ancient, marks the lower line of the common land.

- 7. Diversion along Arnold Street, formerly Primrose Bank, still unadopted after 200 years. Cottages incorporate the 18th century Sportsman Inn, replaced by 1890 on Walkley Bank Road. Formerly there was a row of cottages at the end of Arnold Street, built with gardens on a terrace above Walkley Bank.
- 8. Walkley Bank and New Connection Chapel. Walkley Lane is the ancient road to Hill Bridge. Wads page 30 aces north. Till the 1880s Walkley

Road (formerly Whitehouse Lane) was the main road to Sheffield. In the steep part of the bank were the former public quarries.

The New Connection Methodists (Kilhamites, Tom Paine Methodists) separated from the Conference in 1797. They were established in Walkley in 1819, but I have been unable to find out where. This chapel was built on an undeveloped site in 1862, the year of a more splendid chapel at Broomhill and the College at Ranmoor. The new connection was riding high, partly on the generosity of Mark Firth, and this was by far the most impressive religious building in Walkley to date. Schools were underneath, and in 1865 there was a full-time schoolmaster.

- 9. Freedom Hill Society. The second of the Walkley Societies. Notice some similar 1850's style cottages, but in brick eg. no. 49. This Society had 21 acres laid out in 151 plots. The Baptist Chapel was built in 1885.
- 10. Walkley Road. Originally seen as the main road of the Walkley estates. In 1865, there were five "shopkeepers", two butchers, one shoemaker, one earthenware dealer and a chemist, as well as two beerhouses. There was only one butcher and one grocer on South Road.


The pubs. Some of the founders of the Societies were teetotal, but the Freedom Hotel was established by 1855 and the Freedom House is about the same date. Mere beerhouses are difficult to trace. They came into their own when shareholders defaulted on their payments, and the breweries became substantial landlords of terrace property in Walkley, especially after the great financial upheaval caused by the sewerage levies.

The Board School. The Education Act of 1870 found the C. of E. (and possibly the N.C. Methodist) in charge of education in Walkley. The Church of England, determined to maintain its lead, succeeded in opening new schools on South Road in 1871. The Board followed in 1874, with a typical and fortunately unspoiled example of the work of Innocent and Brown, who were at that time retained as their architects. The infants' school below was by H.L. Paterson (of Walkley Library fame) in 1907.

Below stretched the Hampton View and Grammar School estates. These Societies seem to have ben less fortunate, and many plots were acquired by speculators in the early 50s, who put up little blocks of back-to-backs. Backyard industry was conspicuous there, though traces could be found on other Walkley estates.

11. Fir View Society. The cream of the Walkley Societies. It seems to correspond with the original Walkley Land and Building Society of 1849. 100 plots on 27 acres, which makes them half as big as any others in Walkley. Shares were £120; raised by weekly subscriptions of 2/6d. The £120 included £50 for the land and £70 for building a house. Shareholders were also supposed to pay £3.10s towards the cost of laying out roads.

Carr Road. Originally enjoyed views in 2 directions; southwards across fields to Birkendale or eastwards downhill across the valley to Neepsend. Most early houses faced the sun, so they are at the top of the allotment on the north side. Later this view was blocked by the Whitehouse Building Society, so some of the south side of the road now face north.



Roy Bellamy reports on maps. No building, no ownership shown on 1923 map and a pre - 1900 map shows a small workshop against a boundary across the upper middle of the site. Note Springview House & "Estate" near. For a century and more the public have enjoyed this space. Are the land grabbers now going to steal it from the public?

1889 Map.

At the head Map of the site i.e. Walkley Bank Rd end there were 2 sets of Court Houses, facing Walkley Bank Rd and Elliotville St. Below the highest level behind court 2 there was access to a large laid -out garden with planted trees, a large greenhouse and sheds from the stony walk side. It may have been a garden with planted trees, a large greenhouse and sheds from the stony walk side. It may have been a garden belonging to Springfield House, a house not adjacent but not far away - say 2-3 minutes walk. Whether this was on public or only private use was not indicated on the map.

1893 Map.

Confirmation of 1889 information. Enquires need to be made at Town Hall if these gardens opened to the public or not. Oak Villa - another large villa on Woodview Rd overlooked the site.

1905 Map.

Greenhouse marked and some sheds but no other indications of ambition rather a decline. Old Courts at the head of the site demolished and better houses built. Springfield House written across the map but no other indication of ownership.

1923 Map. No greenhouses, sheds or wall across middle of site. Neglect had taken over to the public's benefit particularly children. Small terrace of houses at the head of the site. Factory built opposite site bottom Woodview Rd.

<u>1935 Map.</u> 'Neglect' continues. More terraced houses at the head of the site. <u>1953 Map.</u> Little change on 1935.

1 31 and 1964.


Only 36, 34 and 32 (houses) remain at the head of the site and public continue to enjoy the public space below them.

1994. Head of site 24 -30 houses built? (Photograph of factory about to be demolished? Could still be seen from Walkley Bank Rd in 1974?).

<u>2004.</u> Now only 5 houses remaining at the head of the site. Factory opposite bottom of the site demolished. Rest of site in a public space state.

2008. Thus the site in dispute was a garden in 1889 and was neglected to such an extent that the public have used the site for a hundred years and now Saxton Mee are claiming, this land is private! The 1905 map shows the beginning of public use. Who do these land grabbers think they are! Others are investigating council action and plans for this <u>public</u> land.
