Question of Councillor Douglas Johnson to Councillor Mary Lea (Cabinet Member for Culture, Parks and Leisure)

In October, I asked whether you would confirm or deny proposals to remove the Central Library into 1 Wellington Street, which is the address of the new HSBC development currently being built at Charter Square. You responded by mistakenly thinking this was a pay-and-display car park. Will you now confirm or deny the proposals to relocate the Central Library to the HSBC office block?

There are no proposals to relocate the Central Library to the HSBC office block.

Questions of Councillor Gail Smith to Councillor Chris Peace (Cabinet Member for Health and Social Care)

1. How much does Sheffield City Council pay per hour to buy in home help and care?

The amount that the Council pays per hour for homecare varies geographically because different parts of Sheffield have different travel costs. Our hourly rates in the current financial year range from £15.36 to £17.05
2. What is the average time a care worker in Sheffield spends at a client's house?

The time a care worker spends depends on the needs of the person they are visiting. Over the last two years the amount of time workers spend with customers has increased. This has been for three main reasons. Firstly, the Council has moved away from very short care calls in line with our sign up to Unison's Ethical Homecare Charter. Secondly, improved commissioning of homecare has reduced travel time and enabled workers to spend longer with the people they care for. Thirdly, the needs of customers have increased as the Council has sought to help greater numbers stay in their own homes rather than having to move into care.
3. How much of the £650m grant announced for adult social care is Sheffield set to receive?

The additional £240m provided in 2018-19 will roll forward in 2019-20 for adult social care. This is meant to make sure people can leave hospital when they are ready, into a care setting that best meets their needs. This should help the NHS to free up the beds it needs over winter.

This resulted in £2.7m in 18/19 for SCC so we could assume the same again for 19/20.

The Budget provides a further £410 million in 2019-20 for adults and children's social care.

This should result in approximately £4.6m additionally to SCC in 2019/20

for adults and children's social care.

Question of Councillor Douglas Johnson to Councillor Chris Peace (Cabinet Member for Health and Social Care)

What steps have been taken, whether through the Accountable Care Partnership or otherwise, to provide for the increased costs to the Council arising from the speedier transfers of patients from NHS treatment in hospital to social care provided by the Council?

All partners in Sheffield have acknowledged the importance of addressing the issues in relation to flow, as highlighted in the recent CQC report. It is recognised that actions to improve flow have consequent impacts on community, primary and social care services. All partners are needing to prioritise funding into ensuring that there is a resilient system.

It is recognised that the Council has a challenging funding situation. The additional Improved Better Care Fund (iBCF) funding was designed to substitute to a certain extent for the loss of Revenue Support Grant. Sheffield CCG has continued the local additional top-up to iBCF funding to Sheffield City Council (circa £5m).

In 2018/19, the Secretary of State has identified an additional £2.7m for Sheffield to '*fund packages of care to prevent older people from going into hospital unnecessarily and getting people home quickly when medically fit to leave*'. Indications are that this funding will be made available again in 2019/20 along with an additional £4.6m to support Adult and Children's services.

The Health and Wellbeing Board hold responsibility for the detailed action plan that was agreed by all partner organisations as a result of the CQC system inspection. STH, CCG and SCC are working closely to resolve the flow issues for patients whose care moves between NHS and social care. A number of improvements have been made across the whole

pathway but there is more work to do.

Question of Councillor Kaltum Rivers to Councillor Jim Steinke (Cabinet Member for Neighbourhoods and Community Safety)

What grass roots consultation has been, or will be, undertaken to have an inclusive strategy for the Council to tackle knife crime?

Initial partnership meetings were taking place with Council and Police officers and a number of community groups in the city prior to the production of the draft Knife Crime Strategy to understand general concerns.

Based on the analysis of the incidents taking place in the city since January 2018 that identifies the main areas for gangs linked into violence and knife crime are

- Broomhall
- Burngreave/Pitsmoor
- NE – Firth Park/Parson Cross etc.
- Manor and Arbourthorne

Meetings are being established in those four areas in November and December.

The purpose of these meetings is to ensure grass roots consultation takes place with local communities and Members to ensure we can produce agreed local plans linked to the specific issues in those areas

Questions of Councillor Alison Teal to Councillor Jim Steinke (Cabinet Member for Neighbourhoods and Community Safety)

1. Does the Council have any plans to engage to work with the children and youth of Sharrow, including by engaging with organisations such as the RESET Team / ‘Don’t be a Tool’?

The Council engages with young people across the city, including in the Sharrow area, through a range of initiatives and activities. Firstly, through the youth provision we commission through our Community Youth Teams and Sheffield Futures a number of youth sessions are run throughout the week in and around the Sharrow area. These services already work really well in partnership with a number of local groups including the Common Ground group at St Peters, and the local gym. We

also have a strong partnership with the Football Unites Racism Divides Charity who run the UMix young people's centre in the area which is a great resource offering sports, music, and youth activities throughout the week for young people and has a really strong community focus.

I know there are lots of other organisations keen to offer support to young people and we would want to encourage and support this where their delivery is safe and good quality and linked in to other local partners. The Reset team appear to be relatively new and not based in the Sharrow area and we are not sure yet what their delivery methods, qualifications or track record is in working effectively with communities and young people, but I will ask officers to make contact and see what they have to offer.

2. To what extent does the Administration believe the level of school exclusions in Sheffield contributes to gang culture, anti-social behaviour, and gun and knife crime?

Officers from Inclusion and Learning Services are a core member of the Operation Fortify Team that has been formed to tackle all areas of Serious Organised Crime including gangs and gun and knife crime. They are working alongside officers from Children's Services, Community Safety and South Yorkshire Police putting together a holistic service to support the vulnerable whether victims or perpetrators and this work will include looking at the background of all young people involved so that we can take an informed view. . The team are also sharing best practise from other local authorities.

Question of Councillor Alison Teal to Councillor Olivia Blake (Cabinet Member for Finance)

What are the plans for Mount Pleasant Guardian Scheme, which is due to end on 14th December when the contract with AdHoc will expire?

Ad Hoc who run the Guardian Service for the Council have requested termination of the Agreement for Mount Pleasant given the poor living conditions for the current occupants.

Regeneration and Property Services are evaluating a number of proposals to keep the site secure until the development current agreement is finalised and the site can be handed over to the contractor.

Questions of Councillor Colin Ross to Councillor Lewis Dagnall (Cabinet Member for Environment and Streetscene)

1. The green bin service has now ended for the season. This is at an earlier date than in previous years. However, there are still many leaves yet to fall from trees this autumn. Why has the service ended before much vegetation is left to collect?

The service has operated for 16 scheduled collections this year – which is more than before. Collections began from the end of March, in line with Easter, as usually this is the start of the gardening season.
2. Has any consideration been given to extending the service later in the year in 2019?

The Council carried out a survey in 2016 to find out what residents wanted from the service. Just over three quarters of respondents wanted the service to start either in March or earlier. Only 28% of respondents wanted their collections to continue beyond November. The majority of respondents to the survey did not support increasing the price for more scheduled collections. We are again planning for 16 scheduled collections for the 2019 season.

Question of Councillor Mohammed Mahroof to Councillor Lewis Dagnall (Cabinet Member for Environment and Streetscene)

- You have been having talks aimed at reaching a sensible solution. Western Road trees are in my Ward. Can you please tell me if these important memorial trees will be retained?
- 20 of the trees proposed for replacement can now be retained, 3 are decaying and cannot.

1. A grit bin located on Hallam Grange Crescent near the junction with Hallam Grange Rise has recently been removed. Amey have confirmed that they do not intend to replace it. How many other grit bins across the city have been removed since last winter? Please give locations.

No grit bins have been removed from the network. An annual review of usage is carried out following the winter each year and this may result in some grit bins being re-located. In 2017/18 there were 1,951 grit bins on the network. There are 2,188 grit bins in place for the 2018/19 winter season. Last year's review resulted in 29 grit bins being re-located.

Question of Councillor Martin Phipps to Councillor Lewis Dagnall (Cabinet Member for Environment and Streetscene)

When did the Administration last review the service offered to the public to address complaints of noise nuisance? What was the outcome of the review?

The previous version of the Night Time Noise Service was reviewed as part of the 2016/17 budget setting process and agreed by Cabinet on the 4th March. Demand and cost data were used to consider options for new service provision arrangements.

As a result of the budget planning process the service was changed to the night enforcement service we have had since which operates on the following hours

Wed 19:30 – 02:00
Thur 19:30 – 02:00
Fri 19:30 – 03:00
Sat 19:30 – 03:00
Sun 19:30 – 02:00

There is an at least annual review of the service with Sheffield housing colleagues to understand demand and customer benefits given many of the customers are Council tenants.

Will the Administration consider re-introducing a night-time noise enforcement service in light of the growth of the late-night economy in Sheffield?

Questions of Councillor Colin Ross to Councillor Jackie Drayton (Cabinet Member for Children and Families)

1. What progress has been made on reducing the overspend on Children's Social Services?

A Cabinet paper detailing our Improvement and Recovery plan and financial outlook for the next four years was presented to Cabinet in September, 2017. Because of the rising demand (national issue – 75% of the Councils exceeding their children's social care budget) we will spend more than the budget. We are in the process of refreshing our medium term financial plans and this will be finalised as part of 2019/20 budget approval process.
2. How many vacancies are there at the present time for Children's Social Workers?

There are 192 full time equivalent Social Workers posts in Children's Social Care. There are currently no vacancies within the Fieldwork Social Work Teams.
3. How many agency staff are employed to cover these vacancies?

As stated above, there are currently no vacancies. However, there has been a significant increase in children coming into care which has led to an increase in Social Workers caseloads. Social Worker caseloads need to be maintained at a manageable level, so at present we are using agency staff to respond to this increase in demand.
4. What is the extra cost in employing agency staff rather than Sheffield City Council employees?

The approximate additional annual cost of employing an Agency Worker rather than employing a permanent SCC staff is:

Senior Fieldwork Manager - £26,000
Advanced Social Work Practitioner – 24,000
Social Worker - £23,000
5. How much of the £84m grant for children's social care announced in the Autumn Budget is Sheffield set to receive?

We are awaiting further details re this funding. From the initial information made available, this is to going to be targeted and expected to be for a small number of authorities and could follow a bidding process.

Questions of Councillor Ben Miskell to Councillor Jayne Dunn (Cabinet Member for Education and Skills)

1. What is the Administration doing to ensure that academies and other schools only exclude students when absolutely necessary?

There has been a lot of work over the last 18 months to increase the availability of support to children at risk of exclusion and to shine a light on this area of work. In partnership with our schools, through the schools forum, we have increased investment in support, including the development of off-site nurture provision, outreach support from special schools, and support from health, such as speech and language therapy. This goes alongside an early help offer to support vulnerable families. Much of the support is developing and sharing best practice.

All of this work goes on regardless of the status of the schools.

2. In light of the fact that the Chancellor has announced more money to fix potholes than to increase schools budgets, what do you think will be the implication of the Government's cuts on Sheffield's schools and the education of young people in our city?

The £400 million announced in the budget is barely more than 10% of the £3.5 billion that has been cut from the education capital budget since 2010

The use of the language of "little extras" is frankly insulting to schools at a time when the Independent Pay Review Body has said they do not have the resources to give any pay rise to staff. Teachers' pay is down £4,000 in real terms since 2010, and schools are struggling to maintain services at current levels due to the lack of funding.

Questions of Councillor Mohammed Mahroof to Councillor Jayne Dunn (Cabinet Member for Education and Skills)

1. Looking at the Secondary School tables, it is quite clear the gap between the South West and North is increasing. What, if anything, is this Administration intending to do?

Council officers are working closely with Learn Sheffield to analyse 2018 pupil outcomes in all key stages. The school categorisation process is underway whereby schools self and peer evaluate their performance, in partnership with Learn Sheffield

Improvement Partners and identify areas for improvement both individually and in Locality groups.

Learn Sheffield also has a 'Support and Challenge' strand, part of its overall School Improvement Strategy, whereby schools identified as underperforming or causing concern attend regular meetings to monitor their improvement plans.

This system is in place for maintained schools and academies.

2. Would you like to join me to put on record our congratulations to Tapton School for finishing top of the tables?

Yes, we congratulate all schools for their successes

3. How much of the £400m grant for schools capital investments is Sheffield set to receive?

We are awaiting further information to establish the full financial implications.

Question of Councillor Penny Baker to Councillor Jayne Dunn (Cabinet Member for Education and Skills)

With regard to the recent report by Barnardo's, which has linked an increase in knife crime to a lack of spaces in Pupil Referral Units (PRU) for excluded children, how many PRU places are there for excluded children in Sheffield. Are these places full? Is there any other support for excluded children who do not get a place at a PRU?

All children in Sheffield who are permanently excluded are placed at the PRU (Sheffield Inclusion Centre). The SIC then has a duty to provide education until such time as the pupil can be reintegrated into mainstream education. This is offered in a number of ways, using a network of alternative provision away from the SIC site, so all excluded pupils are offered a place. In terms of the specific issue around knife crime, we are taking this issue very seriously and are working closely with our partners in the police and schools to tackle it and ensure young people are safe in our city. The Headteacher at the SIC is closely involved in this work at a city level. Our Youth Justice Service and our community youth teams already work with the police to deliver knife awareness sessions in schools, and officers are in the process of submitting a new bid to

the Home Office in partnership with South Yorkshire Police, and a number of local voluntary organisations, to develop more gang and knife crime prevention interventions in schools and targeted work with young people.

Questions of Councillor Alison Teal to Councillor Jayne Dunn (Cabinet Member for Education and Skills)

1. What assessment has the Council made of the impact of the academisation process on the rate and type of school exclusions?

Exclusions have been rising nationally in the last 5-6 years and Sheffield followed that trend until 2016/17 when we saw a drop, followed by a further reduction in 2017-18. In the first part of the 2018-19 academic year, we have seen a further reduction compared to this time last year. Our focus is on improving the outcomes for those vulnerable children who are at risk of exclusion. The national and local trends over a six year period are not likely to be explained by a single factor and most likely are the result of a combination of increased pressure on wider services, pressure on school results, changes to the curriculum, reduction in school funding and wider societal factors.

2. What is the Council's strategy to decrease the number of children being excluded by academies?

There has been a lot of work over the last 18 months to increase the availability of support to children at risk of exclusion and to shine a light on this area of work. In partnership with our schools through schools forum we have increased investment in support, including the development of off-site nurture provision, outreach support from special schools, and support from health, such as speech and language therapy. This goes alongside an early help offer to support vulnerable families. Much of the support is developing and sharing best practice.

All of this work goes on regardless of

the status of the schools.

The Scrutiny Committee had a report and detailed discussion on exclusions only in September which you attended. The Committee resolved:

- (a) Notes the contents of the report now submitted, together with the comments now made and the responses to the questions raised
- (b) Welcomes the work being undertaken to continue reducing exclusions and supporting those pupils who have been excluded
- (c) Requests the Director of Strategic Commissioning and Inclusion Services to submit an update report on the progress and effectiveness of the work undertaken to reduce exclusions and support pupils who have been excluded, and to include statistics in terms of the numbers of excluded pupils from BME communities and those with Special Educational Needs, to the first meeting of the Committee to be held in the 2019/20 Municipal Year.

Questions of Councillor Martin Smith to Councillor Mazher Iqbal (Cabinet Member for Business and Investment)

1. How many retail businesses in Sheffield have premises with a rateable value of £51,000 or less?

There are 4,388 premises classified as Retail Premises with a Rateable Value under £51,000. If pubs and restaurants are included, this figure would rise to 5,234. A significant number of these premises will have RV's below £12,000 and so receive full Small Business Rates Relief which reduces their business rates liability to nil.

2. (a) How many businesses received a purchase order from the City Council in the last 12 months?

From SCC 935;
From SCC including SCR 1,321
- (b) How many of these businesses are located in the City Region?

961
- (c) How many of these businesses are located in Sheffield?

667
- (d) How many of these businesses pay business rates to Sheffield City Council?

The vast majority of businesses in Sheffield have a business rate liability. However, due to the application of various reliefs many businesses have this liability reduced, with a significant percentage having their liability reduced to nil as a result of the application of Small Business Rate Relief.

3. Do the latest plans for the HOC2 project incorporate a new location for the Central Library and, if so, what provision has been made in the project budget for its relocation?

Work on the Central Library is ongoing, this work is being led by Councillor Lea.

4. With regards to the Sheffield Hallam University Master Plan for a single city centre campus:-
 - (a) Will this have a material impact on the HOC2 project?

The Sheffield Hallam plans will have a positive impact on HoC 2 due to the centralisation of their campus with the added concentration of people that brings to the city centre.

- (b) How many meetings have you attended with the University to discuss their master plan? One. Officers have also been in ongoing discussions with the University.

Questions of Councillor Shaffaq Mohammed to Councillor Mazher Iqbal (Cabinet Member for Business and Investment)

Since the last full Council meeting, 3rd October, 2018, have you or the Cabinet Member for Business and Investment made any attempts to contact Mr Wang or a representative of Sichuan Guodong Construction?

Neither myself nor Councillor Dore have met with them, we are currently developing a prospectus of investment proposals available to investors, we will be sending a copy of this to Sichuan Guodong when it is completed.
