

#### 1.0 PURPOSE OF REPORT

1.1 To consider an application for the grant of a premises licence made under section 17 of the Licensing Act 2003.

#### 2.0 THE APPLICATION

- 2.1 The applicant is JGAC Psalter Ltd.
- The application, which was received on 10<sup>th</sup> May 2019, is attached to this report labelled 22 Appendix 'A'.

#### 3.0 **REASONS FOR REFERRAL**

- 3.1 Representations concerning the application have been received from the following and are attached at Appendix B:-
  - 7 x Local resident objections
- 3.2 South Yorkshire Police and the Environment Protection Service have agreed conditions throughout the consultation period with the applicant, and these are attached to this report at Appendix C.
- 3.3 The applicant and objectors who made written representations have been invited to attend the hearing. Copies of the front page of the notices are attached to this report labelled Appendix 'D'
- The consultation end date was extended to the 11<sup>th</sup> July 2019 due to the application not 3.4 being advertised correctly in the first instance. This was rectified, and a full 28 day consultation has been undertaken in line with legislation.



#### LICENSING OBJECTIVES.

#### a) General.

Steps taken to promote all four licensing objectives together.

TO PROMOTE ALL FOUR LICENSING OBJECTIVES WE WILL KEEP: Strong management controls and effective training of all staff so that they are aware of the premises license and the requirements to meet the four licensing objectives with particular attention to: a/ no selling of alcohol to underage people b/ no drunk and disorderly behavior on the premises area c/ vigilance in preventing the use and sale of illegal drugs at the retail area d/ no violent and anti-social behaviour e/ no any harm to children

- Operating Schedule providing the hours of operation and licensable activities during those hours. - Designated premises supervisor confirmed it is obligated to be in day-to-day control of the premises, to provide good training for staff on the Licensing Act (Training Record), to make or authorize each sale - Clear "Challenge 25" information to prevent the supply of alcohol to under-age drinkers. - CCTV system installed with recording option available - Roller metal exterior window shutter will be fixed to ensure that shop front is safe and secure at all times

As a licensed premises we know that it is necessary to carry out our functions or operate their businesses with a purpose of promoting these objectives. We promise to support these objectives through their operating schedules and other measures (including staff training and qualifications, policies, and strategic partnerships with other agencies).

#### b) The prevention of crime and disorder

CCTV System will be installed to monitor entrances, exits, and other parts of the premises in order to address the prevention of crime objective. South Yorkshire Police will be consulted and invited to visit the premises to discuss CCTV requirements.

A clear and legible notice outside the premises indicating the normal hours under the terms of the premises license during which licensable activities are permitted.

Clear and conspicuous notices warning of potential criminal activity, such as theft, that may target customers will be displayed.

Not selling of alcohol to drunk or intoxicated customers.

Custom will not be sought by means of personal solicitation outside or in the vicinity of the premises.

Prevention and vigilance in illegal drug use at the premises. The premises will operate a Zero tolerance drugs policy and staff awareness training will be provided. Posters to notify customers of zero tolerance drugs policies will be displayed.

Staff will be well trained in asking customers to use premises in an orderly and respectful manner.

Door Supervisors. Security Industry Authority registered door supervisors will be provided as required. A written record will be kept of each including name, badge number, time on and off duty and location whilst on premises.

Sale of illicit goods will not be tolerated.

Dispersal / End of Evening Policy. Winding down time after last orders will be utilised. Last orders will be 11.30pm. The pace will be slowed down, music and volume reduced and lights brightened to facilitate this.

Glassware. High volume business and outdoor events will use plastics vessels to reduce alcohol related injuries.

#### c) Public safety

Internal and external lighting fixed to promote the public safety objective.

Well trained staff adherence to environmental health requirements. Training and implementation of underage ID checks.

A log book or recording system shall be kept upon the premises in which shall be entered particulars of inspections made; those required to be made by statute, and information compiled to comply with any public safety condition attached to the premises license that requires the recording of such information. The log book shall be kept available for inspection when required by persons authorised by the Licensing Act 2003 or associated legislation.

All parts of the premises and all fittings and apparatus therein, door fastenings and notices, lighting, heating, electrical, air condition, sanitary accommodation and other installations, will be maintained at all times in good order and in a safe condition.

The Licensee will ensure that staff who arrive early morning or depart late at night (ex. for unpacking, pricing newly delivered goods) when the business has ceased trading conduct themselves in such a manner to avoid causing disturbance to nearby residents. 



I wish to object to some of the terms of the above application Brindiffe is a very quiet residential and conservation area and such hours and activities would clash with that, and cause a public noisounce. Previous management have restyled a traditional pub to altract hard drinking pub-crawlers from Ecclesal Road. I live to meters from the pub and it has been blissfully peaceful during its lengthy closure.

You have received many objections to previous applications for licensing until midnight. The "noisance laws" state that 11.30 pm to 7.00 am are designated steeping hours. Noisy customer dispersal would not even start until 0.30 am and their rancous staff departure could be up to 200 a.m. This affects saiter court residents who have suffered these disturbing trespasses through their private grounds under previous managements. Persistent uncontrolled showing from the terrace has further triggered objections. and can make many evenings a misery.

A previous entertainment licence stipulated that doors and windows should be kept closed, otherwise that noise can be heard within our flats; that entertainers be placed at the far side of the publishmos, and that they cease at 11-00 p.n.

Recoe could the above conditions be applied to this licence? Could the following conditions also be re-applied to reduce nuisonce:

- I Have licensing hours as before from 10am to 11pm, with, at most, a I hour extension on Friday, Jahurday and Jank holidays.
- 2 Cease service on the terrace at 10 oop m and clear by 10.30 (m as previously; and supervise it to contain mais
- 3 Ensue the Kitchen ventilator does not emit noisano
- 4 As a new condition, ban staff from trespassing through Baiter Court grounds and from shouting in the pub grounds.

Parking will be almost impossible: a "no parking" zone was extended last year from the traffic light area all the way to No. 174. This leaves only a dozen spaces for the pub and Psalter Gourt residents. Our 1960's block has no parking space within its grounds, and only 7 single garages for c.25 adults. The far side of Balter Lane is a long, shallow blind corner. Please could that 'no parking' zone revert to its previous position where it seemed to cause no problems for many years?

A pub is a welcome amenity where it co-exists appropriately within its area. I hope the new licensee will respect our peaceful community.



I am a director of Foother Court Ltd, the management company for the block of 16 flats adjacent to the above pub. I write to object to the above application because it would allow licensing of alcohol and entertainment to the bor as late as midnight seven mights a week. This pub has never operated those late hours on a daily basis before.

This is a quiet residential and conservation area and there were degens of objections to previous applications for extended hours. The Naise Protection Act 1996 defines sleeping hours as 11.30 p.m to 7.00 am. It is surely unfair that we residents could face legal action from our religibleours if we regularly disturbed their sleep within those hours, yet the polo is seeking to just that, as it could allow customer dispersal at 00.30 hrs and staff departure between 1 and 2 a.m.

Because there is no pub on the parallel stretch of Ecclesal Road between Hunters Bar and Banner Cross, the inherently rowdy crowd of poberawlers make a detour, via an alley and Psalter Court's private grounds, to and from the roalter pub. Unlike other local pubs this is inappropriately affected by the "vibrant". Ecclesal Road trade. Reports have abounded of noise and antisocial behaviour, some of it offensive.

- (2) In a case where a party wishes any other person (other than the person he intends to represent him at the hearing) to appear at the hearing, the notice referred to in paragraph (1) shall contain a request for permission for such other person to appear at the hearing accompanied by details of the name of that person and a brief description of the point or points on which that person may be able to assist the authority in relation to the application, representations or notice of the party making the request.
- (3) In the case of a hearing under -
  - (a) section 48(3)(a) (cancellation of interim authority notice following police objection), or
  - (b) section 105(2)(a) (counter notice following police objection to temporary event notice),

the party shall give the notice no later than one working day before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

- (4) In the case of a hearing under -
  - (a) section 167(5)(a) (review of premises licence following closure order),
  - (b) paragraph 4(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing licence), paragraph 16(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application for conversion of existing club certificate)
  - (c) paragraph 26(3)(a) of Schedule 8 (determination of application by holder of justices' licence for grant of personal licence),

the party shall give the notice no later than two working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

(5) In any other case, the party shall give the notice no later than five working days before the day or the first day on which the hearing is to be held.

# <u>Licensing Act 2003 – Hearing Procedure – Regulation 7 (1)</u>

This procedure has been drawn up in accordance with the Licensing Act 2003 to assist those parties attending Licensing Committee hearings.

- 1. The hearing before the Council is Quasi Judicial.
- 2. The Chair of the Licensing Committee will introduce the Committee and ask officers to introduce themselves.
- 3. The Chair will ask the applicants to formally introduce themselves.
- 4. The Solicitor to the Committee will outline the procedure to be followed at the hearing.
- 5. Hearing Procedure:-
  - (a) The Licensing Officer will introduce the report.
  - (b) Questions concerning the report can be asked both by Members and the applicant.
  - (c) The Licensing Officer will introduce in turn representatives for the Responsible Authority and Interested Parties who will be asked to detail their relevant representations.
  - (d) Members may ask questions of those parties
  - (e) With the leave of the Chair the applicant or his representative may cross examine the representatives of the Responsible Authorities and Interested Parties.
  - (f) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) will then be asked to:-
    - (i) detail the application;
    - (ii) provide clarification on the application and respond to the representations made.
  - (g) The applicant/licensee (or his/her nominated representative) may then be asked questions by members and with the leave of the Chair from the other parties present.
  - (h) The applicant will then be given the opportunity to sum up the application.
  - (i) The Licensing Officer will then detail the options.
  - (j) There will then be a private session for members to take legal advice and consider the application.
- 6. The decision of the Licensing Committee will be given in accordance with the requirements of the Licensing Act 2003 and regulations made there under.
- NB: 1) At any time in the Licensing Process Members of the Committee may request legal advice from the Solicitor to the Committee. This advice may be given in open session or in private.
  - 2) The Committee Hearing will be held in public unless and in accordance with the Regulations the Committee determine that the public should be excluded.
