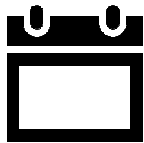
## What's happening, when?



MPs will vote on the proposed regulations on Wednesday



If approved, the measures will be introduced at 00.01 on Thursday 5<sup>th</sup> November



The measures will be in place until Wednesday 2<sup>nd</sup> December



After 2 December, the Government expect different regions to return to the tiers system, depending upon the rates of infection.

## Where can people go?

People must stay at home, except for:



Education



Work (where it can't be done from home)



Exercise and recreation



Medical reasons



Shopping for food and other essentials



Caring for others

## What are the rules on meeting other people?



Households cannot mix with others indoors or in private gardens



Individuals can meet one person from another household in an outside public space



Support bubbles for people who live alone and households made up of single parents and children can continue



Children will be able to move between homes if their parents are separated

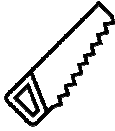
## What can stay open?



Schools, nurseries, colleges and universities will remain open



Hotels and hostels will only open for people who have to travel for work



Workplaces will be asked to stay open if people cannot work from home, including construction and manufacturing



Funerals will be allowed, with a maximum of 30 people attending

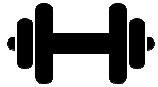


Food takeaways and deliveries can continue



Non-essential retail can stay open for click and collect or delivery only

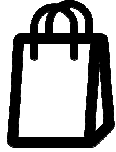
## What must close or is not allowed?



Gyms and other indoor and outdoor sports facilities



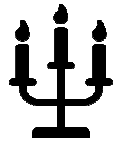
Pubs and restaurants



Non-essential shops must close for in-store purchases



Weddings and civil partnership ceremonies will not be allowed, apart from exceptional circumstances



Places of worship will generally close apart from individual prayer

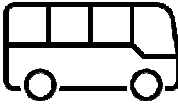


Community centres and libraries will be closed (apart from click and collect)

## Public Health advice



The Government are advising those who are clinically extremely vulnerable not to go to work if they are unable to work from home. Additional advice for those clinically vulnerable/over 60

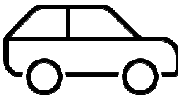


Face coverings must continue to be worn on all public transport
