# What are Local Area Committees? (LACs)

Local Area Committees (LACs) are a way for people to get involved in making a difference to their local communities. Some budgets have already been devolved to the LACs for them to be used on issues and priorities that residents and communities have told us are important to them.

LACs are a chance for people to influence decision making, share their opinion and contribute to positive changes in their community. They are an opportunity for people to say what they would like to see improved in their area.

Whilst LACs have some initial devolved powers, the devolution of further powers will continue to evolve.

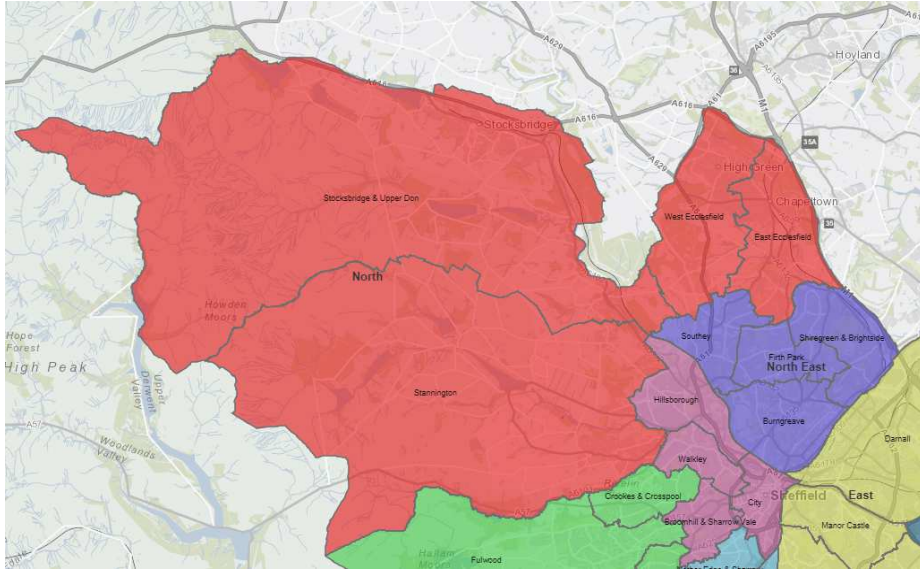



# Features of the North

- The North of Sheffield is a hidden gem with beautiful countryside and a strong sense of community
- Whilst the community has many strengths it also has many needs and contains pockets of deprivation
- The outlying and rural nature of the area brings challenges in terms of access to services and concerns about overdevelopment and local infrastructure



# Features of the North

- Higher than average elderly population (24% aged 65+ [England 18%])
- Below average unemployment (North 4.7%, England 6.6%) but higher than average youth unemployment (North 10.8%, England 9.2%)
- Lower than average deprivation: 16% live in an area within 20% most deprived (England 20%)
- Lower than average crime (North 77 crimes per 1000, England 100)

# Features of the North

- Of Sheffield's 28 wards, the North wards are ranked 17<sup>th</sup> (East Ecclesfield), 18<sup>th</sup> (West Ecclesfield), 20<sup>th</sup> (Stocksbridge and Upper Don) & 21<sup>st</sup> (Stannington) least deprived

- High Green has 2 super output areas \* in most deprived 10% in England
- Stocksbridge, Chapeltown and Parsons Cross have super output areas in most deprived 20% in England
- *An area of approx. 1500 homes*

# Features of the North

- Largest category is 'suburbanites' \* (North 46%, England 21%)
- 24.5% 'hard pressed' \*\* (England 17%)
- Above average community needs score (North 106, England 68)
- Need of civic assets above average (North 35, England 23)
- Need for connectedness above average (North 55, England 21)
- North has double the England average for below average broadband universal service obligation
- Below average grant funding (grant awards per head, North £16, England £34)

\*Located on the outskirts, in areas with high owner occupation, high numbers of detached houses, low unemployment, high qualifications and high car ownership.

\*\*Mostly on the fringe of the UK's urban areas, particularly in Wales and the North of England. High levels of people *in terraced accommodation, high unemployment, low ethnic diversity, high levels of people employed in manufacturing*

# Our engagement

- We engaged 903 people in the North during October and November.
- 646 filled out an on-line survey
- 257 filled out a paper survey either by talking to the staff team or Councillor at a community venue or by talking to one of our voluntary sector partners who carried out consultation for us. These were Stocksbridge Leisure Centre and Rivelin Co

- The survey had 903 responses for the North LAC area
  - 646 online surveys
  - 257 from paper surveys
  - 46% from Stocksbridge ward residents
  - 20% from Stannington ward residents
  - 18% from West Ecclesfield residents
  - 16% from East Ecclesfield residents

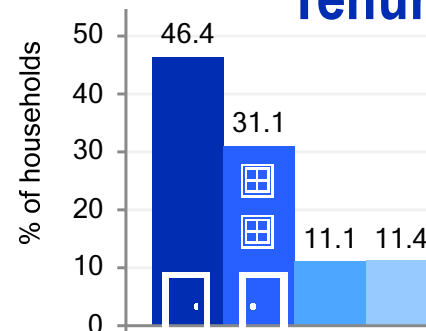

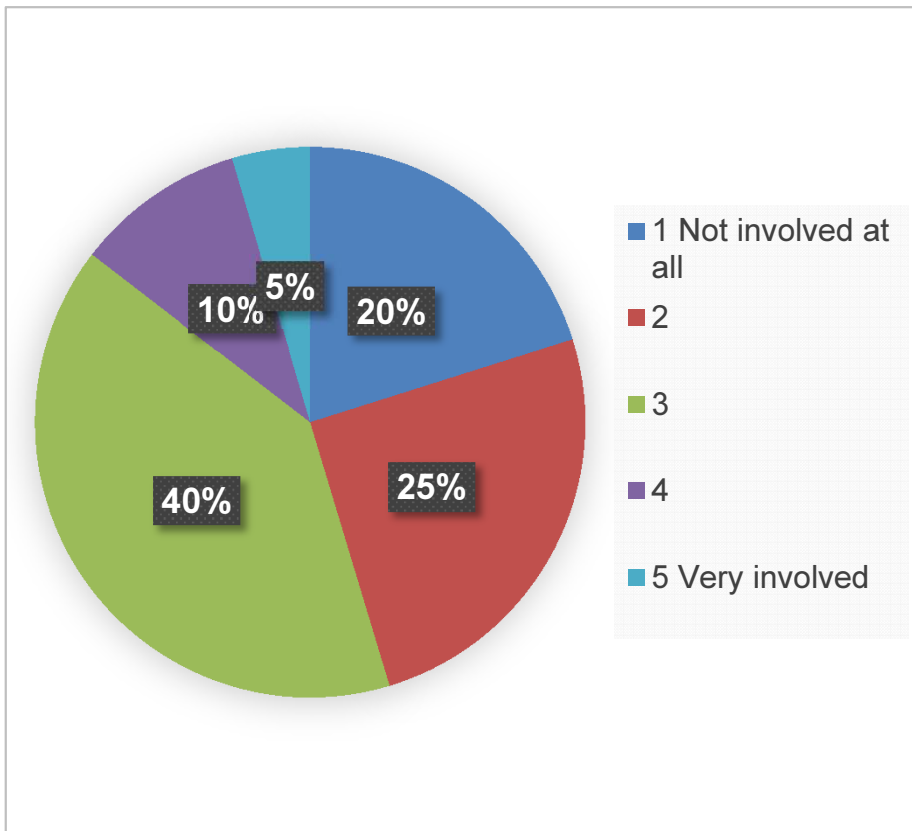

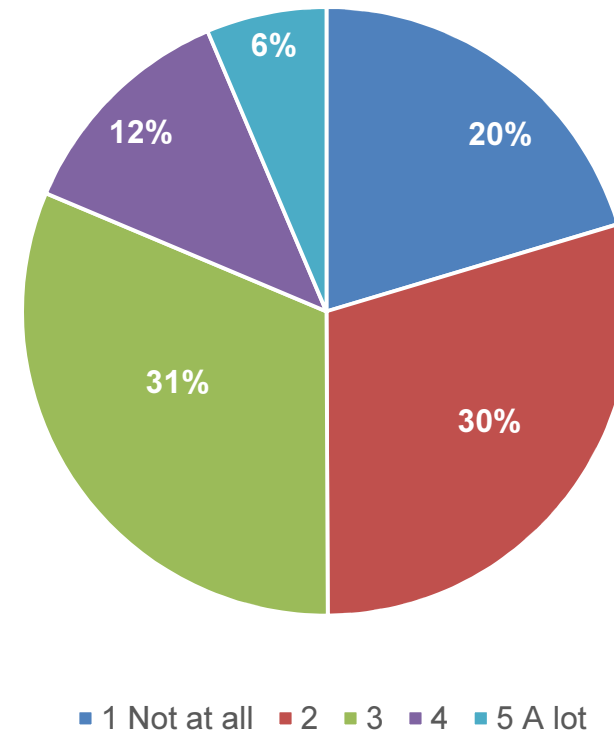

How involved do you feel in your local area?

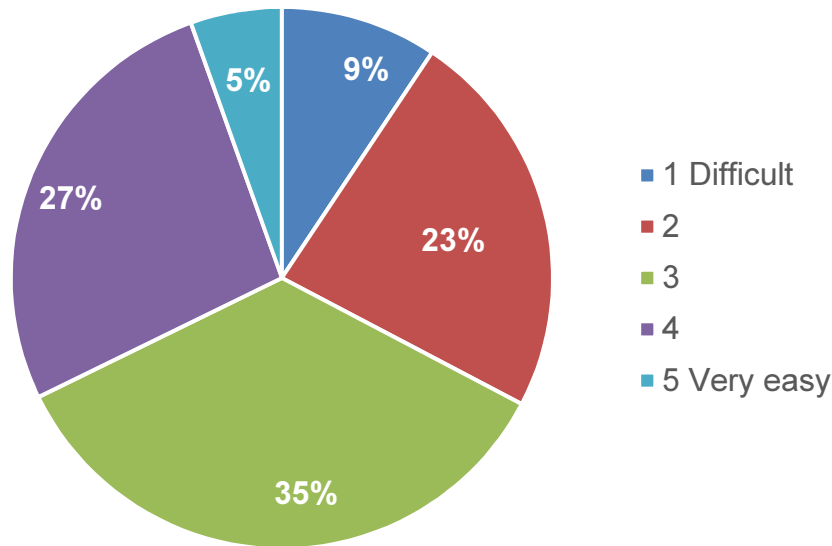


Do you feel local people can influence decision making in their local area?

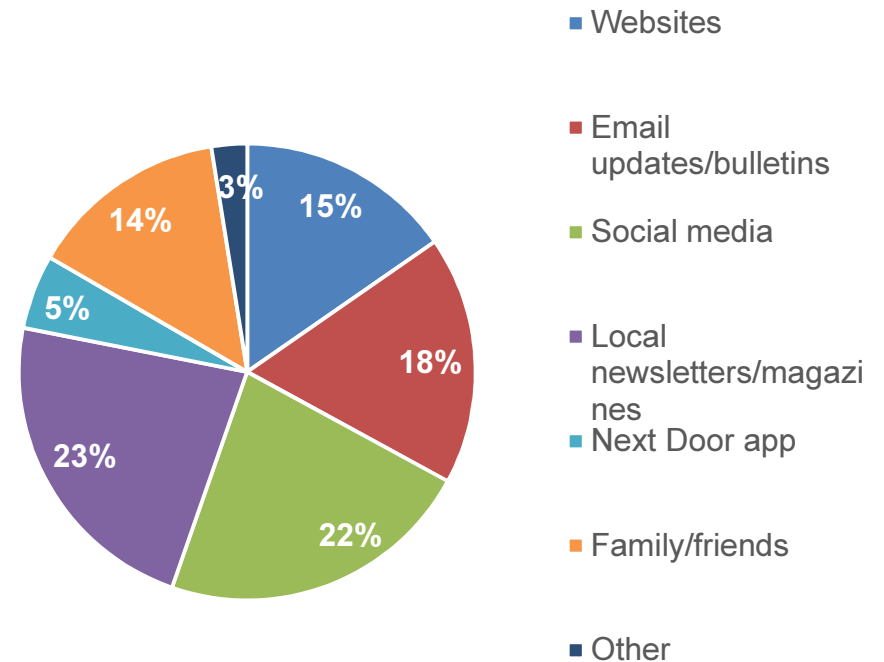

How do you like to find out about news in your local area?

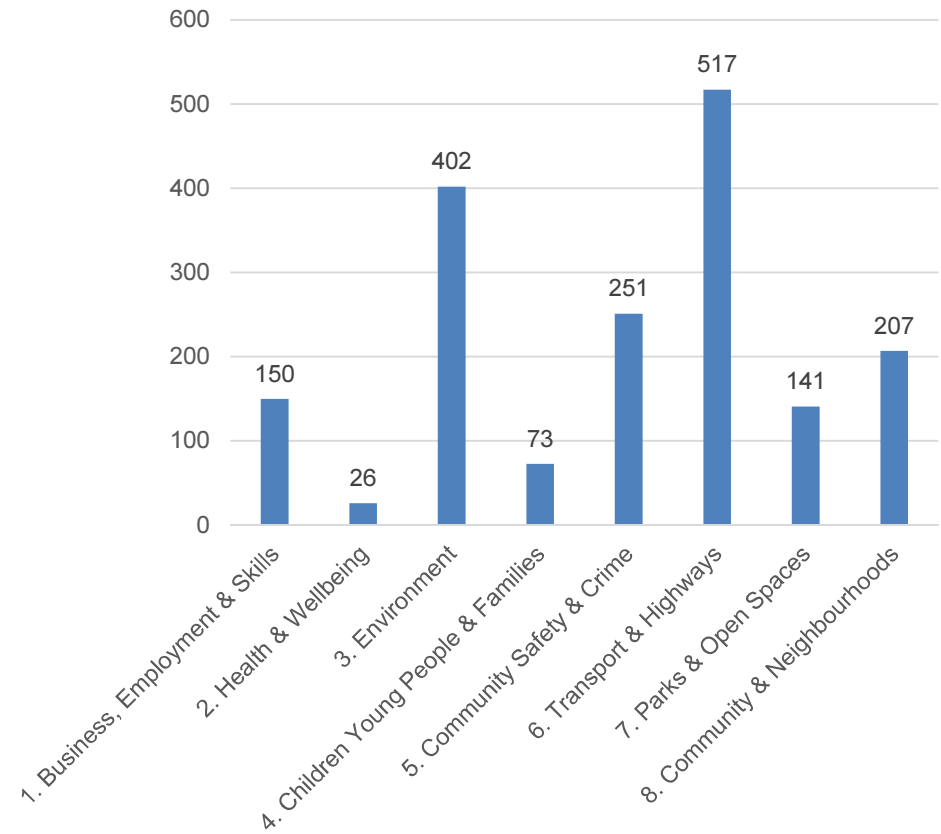
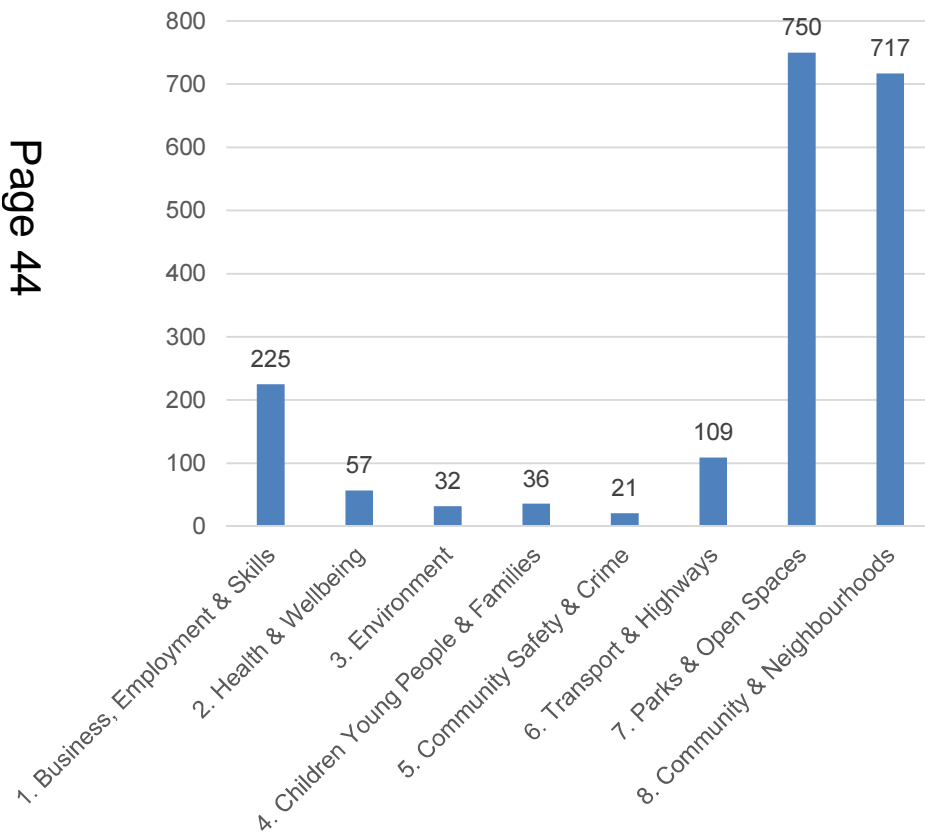

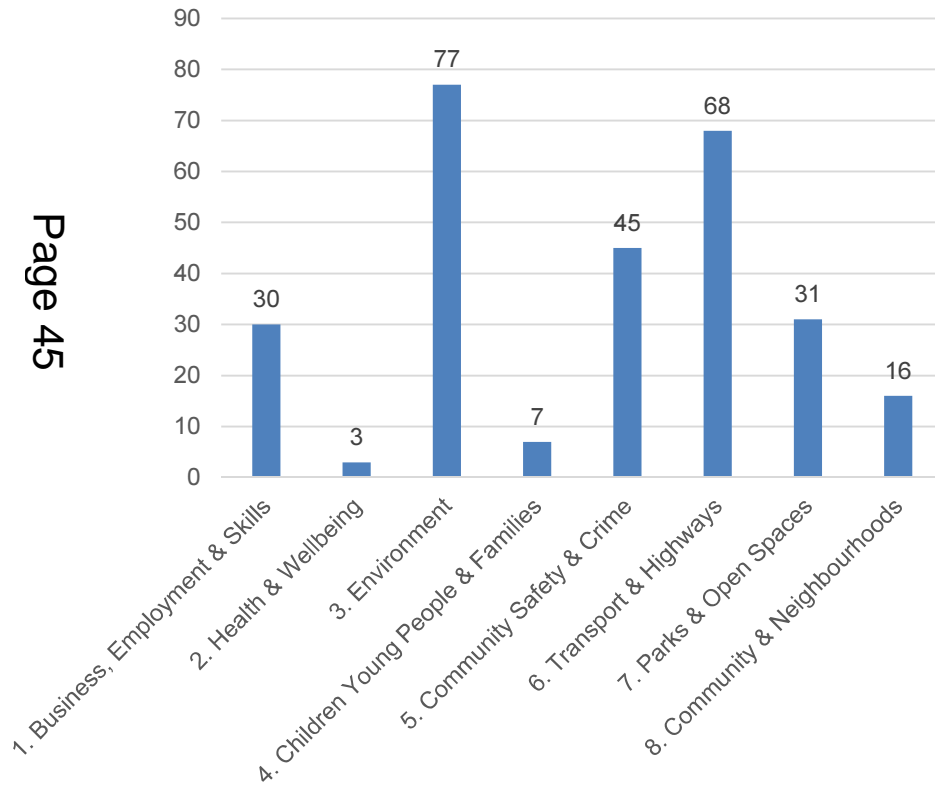

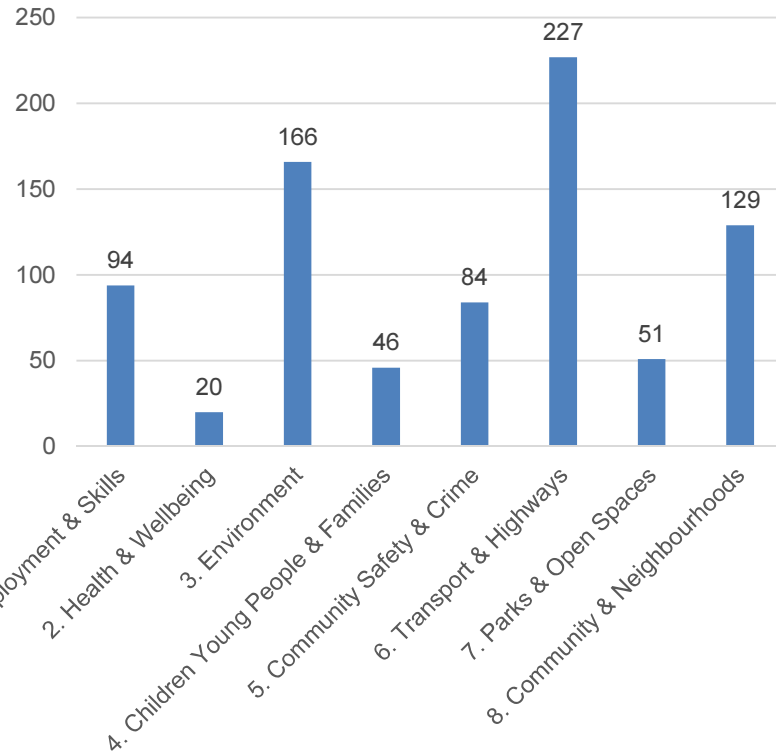

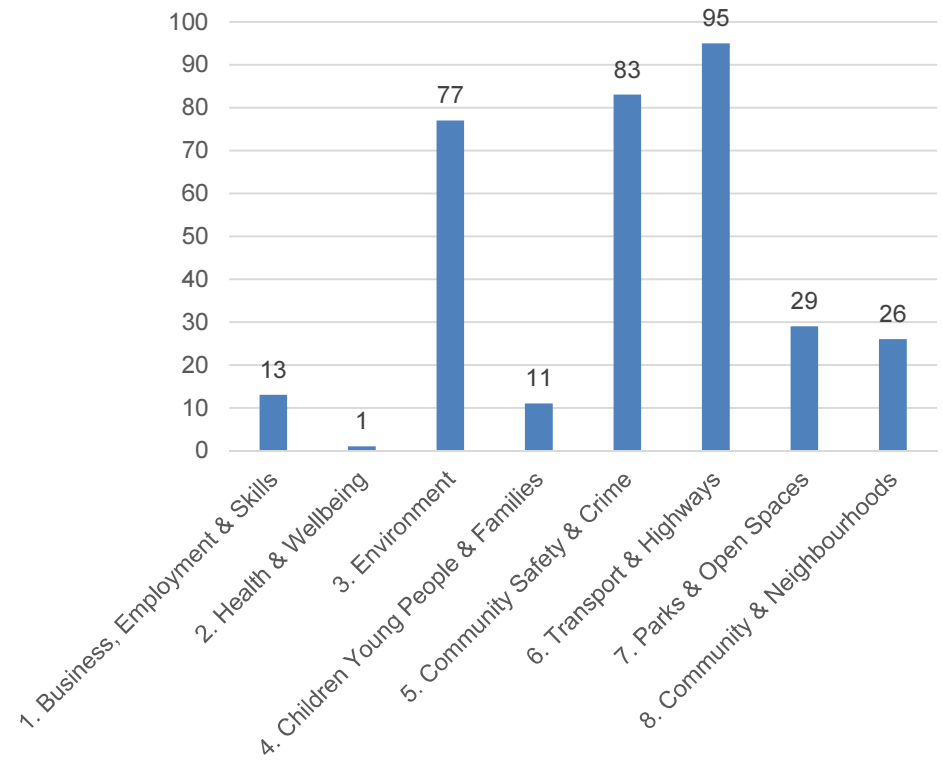

# Themes – further detail

## 1. Transport & Highways

- Improve public transport (buses)
- Improve road surfaces
- High traffic volumes (link with new developments)
- Concerns about traffic around schools
- Need for better walking & cycling routes

# Themes – further detail

## 2. Environment

- Concerns about cleanliness (dog fouling, litter)
- Need to improve appearance of high streets
- Concerns about overdevelopment
- Parks issues – improve facilities, cleanliness

# Themes – further detail

## 3. Community

### a) Crime

- Need for increased Police presence
- Concerns about speeding
- Concerns about anti-social behaviour (including off road bikes)
- Concerns about theft/ burglary (cars)
- Concerns raised relating to social housing

# Ways of working

1. Founded upon partnership – we will continue to work with local Parish & Town councils, service providers and community groups to have the maximum impact through our shared efforts
2. A creative approach – we will bring people together to look practically and positively at how we can address local concerns
3. Goals for the North – we will set goals around key areas that will need a long term approach
4. Development of specific projects & actions – we will explore areas to identify tangible measures we can take.

# Goals for the area

1. The North is a connected place where people can access what they need to play an active part in their community

We will explore:

- Activities for young residents by developing a group to look at current provision & engaging young residents to hear their needs
- Digital infrastructure & digital exclusion
- Routes to share community/ service information
- Routes to develop and promote volunteering
- Work focussed on supporting those in greatest need



# Goals for the area

## 2. The North is a safe place to live in and travel around

We will explore:

- People's experience of local transport routes and other options such as community transport
- Options for road safety around schools including 20mph zones
- Installation of a vehicle activated signs in each ward to flag excess speed
- How to promote the integration of young residents who have been housed in Council accommodation

# Goals for the area

## 3. The North is an attractive place with good facilities

We will explore:

- How we can support local high streets
- How we can support and develop local community groups and buildings
- Improving play facilities, parks and open spaces
- Work to tackle graffiti, litter & fly tipping hotspots

# Next steps

- Sign off of LAC plan – LAC meet March 9<sup>th</sup>
- Development of options for projects and use of LAC budget – March – June
- Development of an action plan to implement
