Update



What have we done so far

- Sheffield Futures contract ended on the 30th September
- 100 members of staff were TUPE'd safely and legally
- Enabled all services to continue to run effectively for 1300 young people during transition
- Property, leases and assets transferred to SCC
- Set up new organisational structure
- Gave people new IT and phones
- Transferred data



Aims

- For young people's services to be:
 - Inclusive
 - ambitious
 - Collaborative
- Enhance services in line with vision & response to feedback from young people, staff and other stakeholders, including Members
- Define new relationship with Sheffield Futures

- Enhancements and Implementation of To-Be Operating Model




Stabilisation and Recovery

- Keep in contact with young people
- Respond to staff survey results
- Embed induction, set up operational management
- Define interim baseline outcomes
- Develop interim Performance Management dashboard
- Develop and implement Covid recovery plan

Review

- Testing and refreshing of the vision and strategy that was developed in March 2020
- Set up operational steering group
- Engaging Young People, Partners and Staff in the testing
- Analysis of existing strategies to identify areas of alignment
- Gap analysis of strategy vs current capability
- Launch of new strategy

- Youth work
- Specialist careers and progression advice for children with special educational needs and disabilities
- Targeted careers advice - NEET and risk of NEET
- Duty and tracking of young people Not in Education, Employment or Training (NEET)
- Youth Involvement
- Child Sexual Exploitation and Criminal Exploitation Team Youth work
- Missing young people return interviews

Youth Work - Universal

Sessions

- Approx 28 sessions delivered per week – majority detached, some virtual

Outcomes

- Increased knowledge of how to stay safe
- Increased / new knowledge of the law in relation to fireworks / bonfire safety
- More of an understanding on how ASB can affect others and the wider community,
- Updated knowledge and awareness of the new Covid regulations and government guidelines
- Greater awareness of support networks and signposting re Health and Wellbeing
- Greater opportunities to access and engage in Sports based positive diversionary
- Awareness of other opportunities including the Youth Services Core Offer

Young Peoples Involvement

- Youth cabinet presentation to Scrutiny on impact of Covid
- Youth cabinet SCR Youth Combined Authority to lobby for greater effectiveness of youth employment initiatives
- Nearly 4000 of Sheffield's young people took part in the Make Your Mark ballot – concluded main local priorities are:
 1. Homelessness
 2. Domestic Violence
 3. Places to go, things to do

Community Youth Teams & Keyworker

- 191 on youth crime prevention caseload
- 84 risk of NEET cases open with school age young people
- 4.1% NEET 16-18 in line with previous year
- 68 multi agency annual reviews undertaken this quarter for young people with SEND



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
